 - Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-1 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled. $\mathbf{2}$ That the first, second, third, fifth, and sixth sections of the act 3 entitled "An act to enforce the provisions of the fourteenth 4 amendment to the Constitution of the United States, and for $\mathbf{5}$ other purposes," approved April twentieth, eighteen hundred 6 and seventy-two, be, and the same are hereby, repealed. 7

For the repeal of the first, second, third, fifth, and sixth sections of the act entitled "An act to enforce the provisions of the fourteenth amendment to the Constitution of the United States, and for other purposes," approved April 20, 1871.
