Lir. Garvey beean by gtating that he had just returned iro.: a trip across tine continent by way of the Soutin. Ie remarked that he liked the south better than any otner
part of the United Stites because he understood the soutnern people better

They beins rery frank and outspoken
in regard to the iegro. Theg make no pretence of being willinz to accept him in any other manner then his present status in the south allows, whereas yeople further north are very hard to underetand because tiney are alwajs on the fence and are likely to flop either way. He went on to say tiat he wanted to tell the negroes how much progress they were meking - none at all, stating that the negroes are the most backuard, the laziest people in the world. Instead of setting out and going after rihat the $j$ want they sit around and expect the white man to
ine referred to Bovker $\because$ ashingrton, as the greatest man the world has producea during this century, and said that his work would live sorever.

Ie pointed out that at the present rate of increase of tine white race in about one or ocssibly two gears tinere woula be no room on this continent for the negro and as it is a white man's country tine nesro
 goins wille tie goinz is good. Fie gaid that he does not blane tine white geople for keepins the negroes donn; he blanes the negroes for allowing them to do it. Iie said the white race has risen to power. and glory, the yellow race has risen to power and flory, and the black race tiru the U. N. I. A., will rise to power and glory.

Referring to his recent trial in New York, Garver said there were three things he misht do - go to Fearen, hell, or jail, but the U. i. I. d. . rould not be stopped whatever might happen to him.

He reserred to the minerels and oil and otiner riches of this
country saying they were for the white man because. this is his counttry, but the wealth of Africa is for the black man becuase that that is his country, and he is going to have them no matter what mean z may be necessary to get them; adding the sooner the white people now colonizing africa realize that and get out tine better for them. Garvey closed his remarks by paying his respects to America, the $G r e a t e s t$ democracy in the world, the greatest Republic in the world, the greatest nation in the world - for the white man.

There were between fifteen hundred and two thousand people in the audience.
