A meeting of the Albany Movement was held at 4:00 p.m., May 14, 1963, at Bethel AME Church. Approximately eighty persons attended. Approximately thirty individuals left the church at approximately 5:00 p.m., and walked through the downtown area of Albany. The remainder of the group dispersed at approximately 6:00 p.m. without incident or arrest.

A meeting of the Albany Movement was held the night of May 14, 1963 at the Mt. Zion Baptist Church, attended by approximately 350 persons. This meeting was addressed by CHARLES SHERROD, Field Secretary, Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee, SLATER KING, Vice President of the Albany Movement, and Rev. JAMES GRANT, Pastor of church. Each expressed disappointment at failure of persons attending earlier meeting at Bethel AME Church to participate in mass demonstrations. Four adult females and one juvenile female left the meeting at 10:00 p.m. and walked to City

they were arrested for parading without a permit and
disorderly conduct. Juveniles were turned over to the
custody of the county juvenile officer and the adults
were incarcerated in lieu of \$200 bond. This group was
led by Samuel B. Wells.

[redacted] further advised that a meeting of the Albany Movement was held at the Bethel A.M.E. Church on the evening of May 13, 1963, and approximately 400 persons attended. Young Negroes were standing outside the church, and they threw bottles at passing police cars and were also allegedly the cause of several false fire alarms which were set off.

Dr. W. G. *Anderson, President of the Albany Movement, Charles Sherrod, Field Secretary for the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, [redacted]

[redacted] addressed the meeting. All of the speakers encouraged mass demonstrations in Albany and spoke words of praise for the Negro demonstrators in Birmingham, Alabama. Dr. Anderson requested persons capable of demonstrating to report at the Bethel A.M.E. Church at 4:00 p.m. on May 14, 1963, for the purpose of staging a demonstration at Albany City Hall. Another meeting was called for 8:00 p.m., May 14, 1963, at the Mt. Zion Baptist Church.

[REDACTED] advised that a meeting of the Albany Movement was held on the night of June 17, 1963, at the Shiloh Baptist Church, and approximately 350 persons attended. He advised SLATER KING addressed the meeting ^{AA} encouraging tighter boycott of white Albany merchants. Attorney C. E. KING discussed the recent court decision favoring racial integration. CHARLES SHERROD, Field Secretary, Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee, announced fifteen additional volunteer students arrived in Albany, Georgia, to engage in instructing young people in ways of combating segregation, and announced meetings to be held in various churches in Albany during the week. There was no announced meeting of the Albany Movement until June 24, 1963.

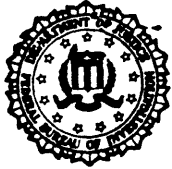

The following information relates to the racial situation in Albany and Savannah, Georgia, the details of which have been furnished to the Civil Rights Division.

The Albany Movement held a meeting at the Shiloh Baptist Church, Albany, on the night of June 24, 1963, attended by approximately 900 persons. The meeting was addressed by [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] described the Birmingham demonstrations and encouraged daily meetings and demonstrations of the Albany Movement for the next 45 days commencing June 25, 1963.

Fourteen persons were arrested in Albany on June 24, 1963, for demonstrating, destroying city property and throwing bricks and debris at foot patrolmen and patrol cars in the Harlem area of Albany. Two police officers were struck by glass fragments and received minor injuries. The windshield of one patrol car was destroyed by thrown debris. The Albany Police moved into the Harlem area in force at approximately 11:20 p.m., June 24, 1963, and closed all business establishments and dispersed persons loitering on the streets.

At Savannah, Georgia, on June 24, 1963, a group of 95 Negroes marched to the City Hall where they held a rally and then marched to the Hotel DeSoto where they blocked the main entrance. When the demonstrators refused to move upon being asked to do so by the manager of the hotel, 53 of them, 35 of whom were juveniles, were arrested. [REDACTED] who led the march, was among those arrested.

At about 8:00 p.m., a group of demonstrators marched to the Savannah Police Department where they held a rally in front of the police barracks. Doar alleged these individuals were arrested without warrants and were not participants in any demonstrations, but were merely picked up off the streets. As an example, [REDACTED] alleged that three of the individuals were arrested as they were getting out of an automobile to enter a church.

ACTION:

Doar requested that the FBI interview [REDACTED] to secure the identities of the individuals arrested who were then to be interviewed regarding the allegation of unlawful arrest. Doar requested these interviews be conducted commencing the morning of 6/22/63. Atlanta instructed to conduct requested interviews.

During the anti-segregation demonstration conducted by the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee the evening of June 19, 1963, demonstrators threw two bottles of liquid, which burned after hitting pavement. One bottle was thrown behind a police paddy wagon, and another was thrown at street. Both incidents occurred in the Negro section of Albany.

[REDACTED] ^{G.A.} stated the demonstrators gathered at Beulah Church located in the Negro section on the evening of June 19, 1963, and [REDACTED] was driving past the church in a car [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] automobile was stoned and severely damaged. [REDACTED] required hospital treatment for facial cuts, and fractured skull as a result of rocks thrown through windows of his car.

[REDACTED] stated a group of Negro ministers, Albany, formed association, and will not allow the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee to use churches of ministers in the association for future meetings. This group desires to meet with city officials and attempt peaceful settlement of differences.

On June 20, [REDACTED] 111th Intelligence Corps, Ft. McPherson, Georgia, was advised of above.

Meetings of the Albany Movement and the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee continued the evening of June 20, 1963, at the Beulah Church and Mt. Zion Church. Numerous automobiles were hit by rocks and stones thrown by demonstrators.

On June 23, 1963, the Cavalcade of White Americans held a rally in Savannah, Georgia, which was attended by approximately 500 white persons. [redacted] spoke to the group and requested no violence even the white people in view of the Negro demonstrations that are currently being held in Savannah. He asked that all white people boycott integrated businesses and patronize only those restaurants that have refused to integrate. It was announced that the next rally would be held on Saturday, June 29, 1963. Busper stickers for vehicles were given out which read, "Join the Kennedy Klan."

Negro demonstrators met in Savannah on the night of June 22, 1963, at the Church of God. There were no incidents in connection with the meeting.

No racial meetings or demonstrations were reported to have been held in Savannah on June 23, 1963. A letter issued by The Most Reverend Thomas J. McFonough, Bishop of the Diocese of Savannah, was read on June 23, 1963, in all Catholic churches of the diocese informing parishioners that beginning with the school term in September, 1963, students regardless of race will be admitted to parish schools where they reside.

A meeting of the Albany Movement was held on the night of June 22, 1963, at the Shiloh Baptist Church in Albany. There were no incidents reported in connection with the meeting. There was no activity reported on the part of the Albany Movement on June 23, 1963, and no arrests or incidents occurred.

On June 28, 1963, seventeen individuals were tried in Recorder's Court, and sentenced as follows:

Two males and one female were charged with unlawfully distributing handbills. They were sentenced to \$54.00 fine or fifteen days in jail. One male was charged with Disorderly Conduct, and was sentenced to two hundred dollar fine, or sixty days in jail. Three males and three females were charged with failing to obey officer, and Disorderly Conduct. They were sentenced to \$102.00 fine or thirty days in jail. Six females and one male were charged with vagrancy, and they were sentenced to sixty days suspended. All of the above individuals remained in jail except the seven individuals whose sentences were suspended.

[REDACTED] advised that on June 29, 1963, no racial activity was carried out in Albany, Georgia.

[REDACTED] advised on June 30, 1963, that five Negroes, three juveniles and two adults, attempted to enter the First Baptist Church, Albany, Georgia. When refused admittance, they knelt on the steps of the church. They were ordered to disperse by an officer, and upon failure to disperse were arrested. They were charged with Disorderly Conduct, and failure to obey an officer.

[REDACTED] 111th INTC., Fort McPherson, Georgia, was advised of the foregoing.

Departmental Attorney D. R. Owen of the Civil Rights Division telephonically advised that the 20 Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) workers who had been arrested on 6/21/63, in Albany, Georgia, in connection with a racial demonstration were scheduled to be tried in local court on vagrancy charges on 6/28/63. Mr. Owen requested that an Agent of the FBI be present to observe the proceedings in local court.

Mr. Owen was asked specifically the basis for an Agent being present and monitoring a local judicial process. He stated that the Department was interested in the testimony which would be offered and the procedures being followed so that a determination could be made as to whether action should be taken by the Federal Government.

It was pointed out to Mr. Owen that it appeared a little irregular if not improper for an investigator to be observing the actions of a court and passing on the procedures, particularly when the Agent was in all probability not a native of the State of Georgia and not familiar with Georgia judicial processes.

It was suggested to Owen that if the Department desired to know the testimony offered, that it would be preferable to have a court reporter present and that a representative of the United States Attorney's office being an attorney and a member of the bar in the State of Georgia would be in a better position to evaluate for the Department's benefit the procedures followed by the court in processing the cases.

ACTION:

Mr. Owen later advised that he had discussed the matter with Assistant Attorney General Burke Marshall and the Department did not desire Bureau Agents to attend the hearing but arrangements would be made by the Department to cover the trial through other means.

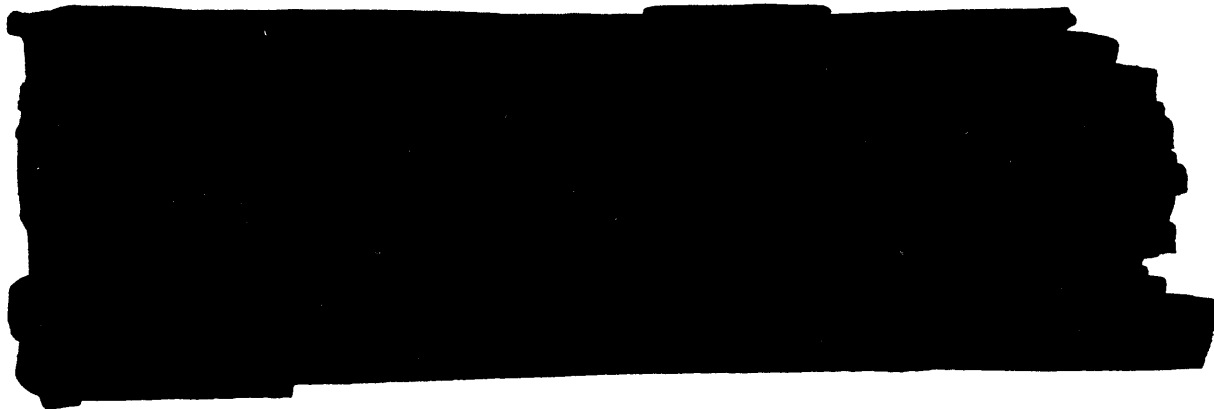
