



RACIAL SITUATION ALBANY, GEORGIA

A meeting of the Albany Movement was held at 4:00 p.m., May 14, 1963, at Bethel AME Church. Approximately eighty persons attended. Approximately thirty individuals left the church at approximately 5:00 p.m., and walked through the downtown area of Albany. The remainder of the group dispersed at approximately 6:00 p.m. without incident or arrest.



A meeting of the Albany Movement was held the night of May 14, 1963 at the Mt. Zion Baptist Church, attended by approximately 350 persons. This meeting was addressed by CHARLES SHERROD, Field Secretary, Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee, SIATER KING, Vice President of the Albany Movement, and Rev. JAMES GRANT, Paster of Church. Each expressed disappointment at failure of persons attending earlier meeting at Bethel AME Church to participate in mass demonstrations. Four adult females and one juvenile female left the meeting at 10:00 p.m. and walked to City

During the anti-segregation demonstration conducted by the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee the evening of June 19, 1963, demonstrators threw two bottles of liquid, which burned after hitting pavement. One bottle was thrown behind a police paddy wagon, and another was thrown at street. Both incidents occurred in the Negro section of Albany.

Beulah Church located in the Negro section on the evening of June 19, 1963, and was driving past the church in a car

automobile was stoned and severely damaged required hospital treatment for facial cuts, and fractured skull as a result of rocks thrown through windows of his car. stated a group of Negro ministers, Albany, formed association, and will not allow the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee to use churches of ministers in the association for future meetings. This group desires to meet with city officials and attempt peaceful settlement of

On June 20, 111th Intelligence Corps, Ft. McPherson, Georgia, was advised of above.

Meetings of the Albany Movement and the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee continued the evening of June 20, 1963, at the Beulah Church and Mt. Zion Church. Approximately 250 persons in attendance at meetings. During the evening, demonstrators in front of the church threw stones at passing cars injuring at least two persons. Numerous automobiles were hit by rocks and stones thrown by demonstrators.



Desegregation demonstrations took place on the evening of June 19, 1963, in Albany, Georgia. Approximately 150 participants attempted a parade into downtown Albany. During the demonstrations, when the Albany Police Department attempted to arrest demonstrators, the spotlight on Police Department car was broken by a demonstrator alleged to be

another Police Department car was broken by an unknown demonstrator throwing rocks. Participants in the demonstrations were led by members of the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee. Twentythree arrests were made. The participants laid on the street prior to arrest, and had to be carried to jail.

On June 28, 1963, seventeen individuals were tried in Recorder's Court, and sentenced as follows:

Two males and one female were charged with unlawfully distributing handbills. They were sentenced to \$54.00 fine or fifteen days in jail. One male was charged with Disorderly Conduct, and was sentenced to two hundred dollar fine, or sixty days in jail. Three males and three females were charged with failing to obey officer, and Disorderly Conduct. They were sentenced to \$102.00 fine or thirty days in jail. Six females and one male were charged with yagrancy, and they were sentenced to sixty days suspended. All of the above individuals remained in jail except the seven individuals whose sentences were suspended.

on June 30, 1963, that five Negroes, three juveniles and two adults, attempted to enter the First Baptist Church, Albany, Georgia. When refused admittance, they knelt on the steps of the church. They were ordered to disperse by an officer, and upon failure to disperse were arrested. They were charged with Disorderly Conduct, and failure to obey an officer.



Owen of the Civil Rights Division telephonically advised that the 20 Student Nonviolent Coordination Committee (SNCC) workers who had been arrested on 6/21/63, in Albany, Georgia, in connection with a racial demonstration were scheduled to be tried in local court on vagrancy charges on 6/28/63. Mr. Owen requested that an Agent of the FBI be present to observe the proceedings in local court. Mr. Owen was asked specifically the basis for an Agent being present and monitoring a local judicial process. He stated that the Department was interested in the testimony which would be offered and the procedures being followed so that a determination could be made as to whether action should be taken by the Federal Government. It was pointed out to Mr. Owen that it appeared a little irregular if not improper for an investigator to be observing the actions of a court and passing on the procedures, particularly when the Agent was in all probability not a native of the State of Georgia and not familiar with Georgia judicial processes. REC- 72/57 It was suggested to owen that if the Department desired to know the testimony offered, that it would be preferable to have a court reporter present and that a representative of the United States Attorney's office being an attorney and a member of the bar in the State of Georgia would be in a better position to evaluate for the Department's benefit the procedures followed by the court in processing the cases. **JUL 8** 1963 **ACTION:** Mr. Owen later advised that he had discussed the matter with Assistant Attorney General Burke Marshall and the Department did not desire Bureau Agents to attend the hearing but arrangements would be by the Department to cover the trial through other means.




