Results of examination:

Specimen Ql is similar to a .22 Long Rifle caliber lead bullet manufactured by Winchester-Western. This bullet was fired from a barrel rifled with six lands and grooves. Because of the extensive mutilation of this bullet it was not possible to determine the direction of twist of the rifling. The number and width of the land and groove impressions appearing on specimen Q1 are similar to those produced by a large number of popular brands of American and foreign-made hand and shoulder weapons.

There are not sufficient microscopic marks remaining on specimen Q1 to identify the specific weapon from which it was fired. However, the few marks remaining on this specimen may be of value to eliminate suspect weapons which may be recovered.

Specimen Q2 is similar to a .22 Long Rifle caliber lead bullet. This bullet has been mutilated to the extent that it is of so value for identification purposes.

MARION S AGE, Executive Secretary of the Albany Movement, appeared before the Albany City Commissioners requesting results of action taken by City Commission on demands to return bond money of Negroes arrested in racial demonstrations and action on previous demands to employ Negroes in Municipal Government. The following are the answers given by the Albany City Commissioners:

### 1. BONDS

"Consistent with proper separation of Government as well as in continuation of previously stated policy and in full fairness to any and all who are arrested for violations of valid ordinances of the City of Albany, the Board of City Commissioners feels that it cannot enter into the area of the city recorder through legislative action to affect the outcome of cases to be tried before that or any other court by dismissal of case, return or alteration of required bonds or any other legislative interference in judicial matters."

#### 2. FACILITIES

"The City Commission does not exercise control of privately owned businesses with regard to their selection of clientele or patronage and, therefore, have no jurisdiction and will take none over that position of their operation; City has repealed all ordinances requiring segregation in private businesses; City is not operating any facilities under its control on a segregated basis."

#### 3. EMPLOYMENT
