USA EDWARD F. BOARDMAN, Middle District of Florida, and USA CLINTON N. ASHMORE, Northern District of Florida, were furnished the following information on 5/28/63 in accordance with instructions set forth in re Bureau teletype.

Chain cafeterias such as Morrison's, S and W, and Polly Davis, are segregated in all the significant municipalities such as Jacksonville, St. Augustine, Daytona Beach, Ocala, and Tallahassee, Fla.

The motels, hotels, and theaters are also segregated in these cities as are practically all the locally owned restaurants.

Lunch counters in variety stores such as Woolworths, McCrory's, and Liggett Drug Stores, are segregated in Ocala and St. Augustine, while they are integrated in Daytona Beach, Jacksonville, and Tallahassee. Lake City, Fla., has no chain variety stores and all locally owned restaurants and lunch counters are segregated.

The gasoline service stations uniformly maintain segregated rest rooms in all the cities in northern Florida.

The United States Attorney for the Northern District of Florida was also advised concerning the current demonstrations being conducted by the Congress of Racial Equality at the theaters in Tallahassee, Fla.

[REDACTED] telephonically contacted the Jacksonville Office of the FBI on June 17, 1963 and furnished the following information:

[REDACTED] b7c, b7d received a telephone call at approximately 10:00 AM June 17, 1963, from an unknown man who stated "Watch out for the KKK" and then hung up.

[REDACTED] on believed the call may have been the result of a meeting he attended on June 16, 1963, between the NAACP and St. Augustine City officials for the purpose of discussing integration problems. He stated that he was required to furnish his name, address, and place of employment at the meeting. He further advised that the discussion became "heated" at the meeting and therefore felt the phone call may have been instigated somehow as a result.

[REDACTED] he intended to immediately notify local police authorities concerning the anonymous telephone call.

Today WFOY, a local radio station at St. Augustine, Florida, issued a United Press International news release on their 7:00 a.m. broadcast. The release has been killed in all subsequent broadcasts. This release stated that Negro leaders in St. Augustine, Florida, say they are arming themselves in case the battle for equal rights becomes violent. The release further said Negro leader, Robert B. Hayling, a St. Augustine dentist, stated, "I and others have armed and we will shoot first, and ask questions later." Few persons in St. Augustine heard the original broadcast but a few hours later garbled versions were sweeping the city to the effect that Hayling had said, "Unless St. Augustine integrates right now, we will come out shooting."

[REDACTED] stated he had received numerous telephone calls from white citizens offering their services and their arms to put down any Negro violence.

On June 20, 1963, a meeting is scheduled between Negro leaders of the NAACP and the City Commission, St. Augustine, Florida, to discuss the formation of a biracial committee and to give leaders of the motel association, restaurant association and other community businesses an opportunity to present their views on desegregation.

On June 18, 1963, [REDACTED] another leader in the NAACP movement, St. Augustine, Florida, had stated that racial feelings amongst the Negroes were well under control; that there was no Muslim or other violent influence that he could observe; and that the colored community was looking forward with hopeful anticipation to the meeting scheduled for June 20, 1963.

claimed that he and other members of the NAACP had no knowledge that Hayling was to make such a release, and that he was thoroughly in disagreement with the tone and the effect that it would have on the community. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] said that as soon as possible he will meet with other local leaders of the NAACP in an effort to repair the damage done by Hayling's release.

On June 19, 1963, Dr. Robert B. Hayling stated that he had spoken yesterday with a reporter of the United Press International and had made the statement set out above. He said he had received numerous telephone calls today from all of the wire services and he had explained to them that the essence of the desegregation movement in St. Augustine is that of nonviolence. He stated that should there be any demonstrations in the future in St. Augustine, that the pickets and persons sitting in would be unarmed and instructed to use no violence.

Dr. Hayling stated he felt that the chief of police was such a segregationist that he would not afford the movement proper protection. Dr. Hayling stated that at a meeting on June 16, 1963, between the NAACP and St. Augustine city officials Chief Stuart on two occasions while reading from a magazine article mispronounced the word Negro as "nigger."

Dr. Hayling also said that after leaving the meeting he had received anonymous telephone calls which stated, "better watch out" and "the KKK will get you." He said he had told [REDACTED] about these telephone calls and had assumed that [REDACTED] reported them to the FBI.

Dr. Hayling said that at the June 20, 1963, meeting between the NAACP leaders and city commissioners, Robert Sanders, Florida State Field Secretary of the NAACP, will be present.

[REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] contacted him concerning telephone calls received on June 17, 1963.

[redacted] St. Augustine, Florida, received telephone call from Governor's Office today requesting his Sheriff's Office to investigate a traffic situation on the Bridge of Lions within the City of St. Augustine. According to the Governor's Office, the bridge tender had reported to the St. Augustine City Police that a car filled with Negroes was stopping on the bridge at various times interrupting the flow of traffic. According to the Governor's Office, the bridge tender was told by the St. Augustine Police Department to "shoot them."

[redacted] Dr. Robert B. Hayling is alleged to have said that he doubted that the St. Augustine City Commissioners would meet with the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) today and if they did not "all hell would break loose." According to [redacted] the Governor's Office *b7c* advised him should Hayling make any statement threatening violence, he should be arrested. [redacted] in hopes of having a conversation today with Robert Sanders, Florida Field Secretary for the NAACP, who is in St. Augustine, Florida, for today's meeting. He will complain to Sanders of Hayling's inciting statements and actions in the hopes of alleviating the racial tension.

[REDACTED] St. Augustine, Florida, advised he had attended the meeting of the St. Augustine City Commission and representatives of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) held at 1:30 PM on June 20, 1963. Approximately 25 white and 50 colored persons attended. Of the five City Commissioners only Harry Gutterman and H. L. McDaniel were present. Florida State Field Secretary for the NAACP Robert Sanders, Dr. Robert B. Hayling, and local NAACP Vice President Clyde Jenkins, represented the Negroes. The meeting was opened by acting Mayor Commissioner Harry Gutterman who defined the terms of conduct and then opened the floor for any speeches to be limited to 3 minutes. Jenkins came forward to speak for the NAACP and advised that they had nothing to say but had come to hear what the Commission had to say. Gutterman remarked that things had been on a congenial level at the conclusion of the meeting on June 16, 1963. However, he accused the NAACP of acting in bad faith by issuing press releases stating they were arming themselves and would shoot first and ask questions later. He said that as far as the city was concerned all of its facilities were integrated and all racial signs had been removed. He then adjourned the meeting until June 28, 1963.

On June 20, 1963, [redacted]
[redacted] St. Augustine, Florida, advised he had
received what he considered to be a threatening telephone
call at about 8:30 p.m. The male caller said [redacted]
was in the "Commie Party" and that "He better be careful
because he was on the head of the list." b7C

On June 21, 1963, [redacted]
[redacted] St. Augustine, Police Department,
were advised of this call. b7C

On June 20, 1963, Dr. Robert B. Hayling advised
that the results of the meeting with the city commission
on that date were unsatisfactory and that demonstrations
would not be put off until the meeting set for June 28,
1963. He said that some members of the National Association
for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) had criticized
him for his statements to the press. He claimed that he
had not wanted to create the impression of violence but only
to state that he would protect himself against violence.

Hayling said that prior to the meeting of
June 20, 1963, Charles Berrier, St. Augustine City Manager,
is reported to have said that no quorum of the city commission
was present and the only purpose of the meeting was to "Let
the Negroes blow off some steam." b7C

[redacted] St. Augustine, FLA.
[redacted] and frequently mentioned by Negroes
as a leader of the segregationists in St. Augustine, advised
that Berrier had foolishly made the statements ascribed to
him above in front of reporters from Jacksonville, Florida,
prior to the meeting. [redacted] said that he and other staunch
segregationists were advocating nonviolence and did not
anticipate any violent reaction to a Negro demonstration.

Robert Saunders, Florida Field Secretary for the NAACP, called the Jacksonville Office of the FBI on June 20, 1963, to report rumors of possible cross burnings. The Sheriff's Office and the Police Department at St. Augustine were alerted. b7c

On June 21, 1963, [redacted] advised that there had been one incident during the night, one white person reported being cursed and slugged. This person, [redacted] American Finance Company, St. Augustine, advised he was making a business call in the colored section of town at about 10:00 p.m. last night when he was blocked off by a car driven by two Negroes. He was cursed, knocked to the ground by one of the Negroes and received a slight cut from a knife or beer opener. He succeeded in escaping without further damage and reported the matter to the police department.

During the day, Negroes have been canvassing lunch counters and stores in the city to determine if they employ Negroes and will serve Negroes.

Negroes were turned away from a municipal putting course leased to Bert Stone, St. Augustine, Florida, despite the city commissioner's statement that all city facilities were desegregated. b7c, b7d

[redacted] St. Augustine, advised he would notify the FBI as soon as a definite date and time had been set for the demonstration which would consist of picketing of all those facilities, both municipal and privately owned which discriminated against Negroes. b7c

[redacted] 111 Intelligence Corps Group (INTC), Jacksonville, Florida, was advised of the above information on June 21, 1963.

Sporadic picketing continued in Saint Augustine, Florida, on June 23, 1963, at the McCrory's and F. W. Woolworth stores. The lunch counters at these two establishments remained closed and there were no incidents.

Henry Twine, one of the local NAACP members, advised his organization appeared before the Saint Augustine, Florida, City Commission on the night of June 23, 1963. At this meeting the NAACP requested to be advised why Negroes had been barred from the public library and a city-owned golf putting course. The commissioners replied that such action was a misunderstanding on the part of the operators of the library and the putting course as they had been instructed to admit everyone regardless of race. They stated all city facilities had been ordered desegregated. The commissioners reiterated that city civil service jobs are open to all upon application and race will not be a factor in any appointments.

The commissioners were requested by the NAACP to appoint a biracial committee and take a definite stand on the racial situation. The commissioners believe a biracial committee is unnecessary and that everything under the control of the City Commission has been desegregated. According to the commissioners, the problem as to further desegregation is now between the Negroes and private business. An ordinance was passed limiting the size of signs used by pickets and prohibiting loitering or barring the entrance to any business establishment being picketed.

At the conclusion of the meeting, Dr. Robert Hayling, a local NAACP spokesman, requested Mayor Shelley to reconsider the appointment of a biracial committee at which time Mayor Shelley reiterated the Commission's decision and Dr. Hayling remarked that something had to be done; however, he made no threat of demonstrations.

Mr. Twine stated he did not know of any scheduled demonstrations other than picketing which is scheduled for June 29, 1963. *At August 2, 79*

The following information relates to the racial situation in Florida, the details of which have been furnished to the Civil Rights Division.

Picketing continued in Saint Augustine, Florida, on July 1, 1963, at the McCrory's and F. W. Woolworth's stores.

On July 1, 1963, at Panama City, Florida, Negroes appeared at lunch counters at two drugstores and two variety stores in the downtown area. In each instance the lunch counter was closed. No arrests were made.

A representative of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) at Panama City has advised that sit-ins at the same places will probably be attempted again on July 2, 1963.

The Daytona Beach Police Department advised that reportedly on July 4, 1963, several bus loads of Negroes from out of town will go on the beach at Daytona Beach.

It was also reported that the Restaurant Association of Daytona Beach has agreed to integrate completely.

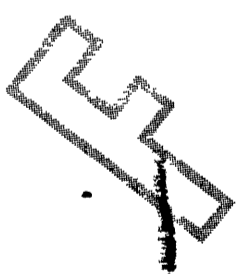

Efforts to obtain service at McCrory's resulted in the closing of the lunch counter. Woolworth's lunch counter was closed when the store opened in the morning and has remained closed.

Other drug stores operating lunch counters in St. Augustine, Florida, were tested and Negroes left when they were refused service.

The picketing concluded at 3:30 PM. Pickets were reasonable in number and there were no incidents.

On June 28, 1963, at 8:00 PM the St. Augustine, Florida, City Commissioners will hear petitions from local National Association for the Advancement of Colored People representatives.

Robert Andreu, City Attorney, St. Augustine, Florida, advised that teenage Negroes picketed the St. Augustine Civic Center and F. W. Woolworth Company Store on June 25, 1963, from approximately 1 PM to 5 PM. The pickets marching in front of Woolworth Store were comprised of four males and one female. Signs were carried stating "If we spend money here, why can't we eat here?" There were no incidents and very little attention was paid by passers-by. It was noted that Negroes as well as whites traded at the store while the picketing was in process.

Andreu continued that three males and one female were utilized in picketing the St. Augustine Civic Center. He said that H. B. Chitty, Chamber of Commerce head, invited the pickets in for free orange juice and asked them why they were picketing. H. B. Chitty advised that the pickets did not accept the free orange juice and he received no answer. H. B. Chitty advised that he had received no reply to his questions as to why they were picketing the Civic Center as it is an integrated facility. Andreu continued that after this incident, picketing was discontinued for a short time at the Civic Center but was later renewed. There were no incidents.

Henry Twine, leader in the local National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), advised on June 25, 1963, that the demonstration had been sponsored by his organization. He claimed that he did not know whether the picketing would continue or what future plans would be formulated.

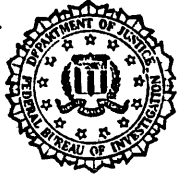

Information set out below was obtained from the St. Augustine, Florida, Police Department, Sheriff's Office, and observation by an Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

On June 26, 1963, at approximately 1:00 PM, Negro teenagers conducted sit-ins at McCrory's, Woolworths, and Service Drug Store, all located in St. Augustine, Florida. Lunch counters in these establishments were immediately closed and all unoccupied seats were taken up. Fifteen Negroes were observed at Woolworths lunch counter while four or five youths sat-in at the other counters. At about 2:00 PM the manager of McCrory's closed the entire store and the Negroes left without incident. The store was later reopened.

The owner-manager of McCartney's Drug Store, St. Augustine, Florida, refused counter service to Negroes and advised them that a request would be made for their arrest for trespass should they sit-in. The Negroes then left without incident.

Woolworths was also picketed by teenagers protesting their segregation policy. Sit-ins, and picketing were concluded at approximately 3:30 PM on June 26, 1963.

The following information relates to the racial situation in Florida, the details of which have been furnished to the Civil Rights Division.

Picketing continued in Saint Augustine, Florida, on July 5, 1963, at the McCrory's and F. W. Woolworth's stores. In addition, picketing was instituted at three local drugstores which maintain segregated lunch counters. There were no incidents reported.

On July 5, 1963, Mr. G. M. Eubanks, Vice President of the local chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), advised that picketing of the above businesses would continue on a daily basis until further notice.

Mr. Eubanks further informed that Dr. Robert B. Hayling of Saint Augustine, who has spoken in behalf of the NAACP, holds no office and does not control the local chapter of this organization.

On July 5, 1963, a conference was held between City Manager B. Arnold and the Palm Beach City Attorney who decided to admit Negroes to Phipps Park. The public beach proper is by ordinance for residents of Palm Beach and their guests only. Policy has been established that if Negroes seek access to this beach, they will be approached by the police, the city ordinance explained and if they decline to leave the beach their names and addresses will be taken.

**RACIAL SITUATION
IN FLORIDA**

In connection with the shooting incident which occurred at the residence of Dr. Robert Hayling, spokesman for the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), St. Augustine, Florida, on July 2, 1963, [redacted] was charged with shooting at or into a vehicle and placed on \$500 bond. Three white juveniles reportedly will be charged with being accessories to the shooting and will have hearings in juvenile court next week, no date set.

[redacted] Negro, was charged with shooting into a vehicle, and two other Negroes were charged as accessories to the shooting. The Negroes entered pleas of not guilty, and no date has been set for a hearing for them.

At Panama City, Florida, a group of Negroes appeared at lunch counters at two drugstores and two variety stores at noon on July 3, 1963. In each instance, the counter was closed. No violence occurred and no arrests were made.

Small Negro groups continued testing lunch counter facilities at four business places in Ocala, Florida, on July 3, 1963. They were denied service at three of the places and were served at a fourth. No incidents occurred at any of the establishments.

On July 4, 1963, 75 to 100 Negroes, both male and female, used the public beach at Boynton Beach, Florida, and no incidents resulted.

At Palm Beach, Florida, on July 4, 1963, five Negroes, including one female, all of whom claimed NAACP membership, attempted to use the city beach at Phipps Park. Entry was refused and the beach was closed to all who attempted to enter thereafter. Those leaving the beach were denied re-entry.

The five Negroes appeared at the City Hall and the City Manager agreed to discuss the matter only with their spokesman. The group refused stating that the City Manager could speak to all of them or to none.

The Chief of Police at Palm Beach advised that there was some use of the beach on private property by Negroes; however, no complaints were received and no police action was taken.

No racial integration activity was reported at Homestead, Florida, on July 4, 1963. Reportedly, a NAACP leader informed Mayor Richard Conley of Homestead that plans to attempt integration activities had been canceled due to the possibility that too many people would be drinking and any attempt at peaceful integration might get out of hand.

On July 2, 1963, Doctor Robert Hayling, National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) Spokesman, St. Augustine, Florida, advised that he had telephoned the United States Department of Justice and other individuals who he did not identify concerning the shooting at his residence. He claimed that at approximately 1 PM July 2, 1963, he had received an anonymous telephone call from an unidentified individual who stated in effect that although Hayling was missed last night they would probably be able to get him tonight. Approximately 15 minutes after this call Hayling received another call containing the same warning. Both calls were local and in Hayling's opinion were made by teenagers. On July 2, 1963, Chief Virgil Stewart, St. Augustine, Police Department, was advised of the additional threats received by Hayling.

Hayling complained that the St. Augustine Police Department and Mayor were not vigorously pursuing the troubles that occurred at his residence in that they are not and have not been taking proper precautions to keep the white youths in check but rather have concentrated solely on the Negro youths. Hayling further stated that he did not know if he would be able to contain some of the Negro youths whom he is advising.

After consulting with Florida States Attorney Dan Warren, Daytona Beach, Florida, Assistant States Attorney Nathan Weinstein, St. Augustine, Florida, on July 2, 1963, directed that [REDACTED] be charged with shooting into a vehicle. The affidavit in this matter was signed by Deputy Sheriff [REDACTED] and a warrant was issued. [REDACTED] was already in the custody of the St. Augustine Police Department.

The three other white youths [REDACTED] were charged as accessories but no warrants were issued since they are being handled as juveniles.

[REDACTED] Negro, was also charged with firing into a motor vehicle. The affidavit was signed by Sergeant [REDACTED] St. Augustine Police Department, on July 2, 1963, and a warrant was issued.

[REDACTED] both Negroes, were charged as accessories. Affidavits against them were signed by Sergeant [REDACTED] and warrants were issued. All three apprehended by the Sheriff's Office and lodged in the County Jail on the night of July 2, 1963.

On July 3, 1963, the above individuals with the exception of the white juveniles appeared for preliminary hearing before the County Judge at St. Augustine, Florida. The Negroes all entered pleas of not guilty and were released on \$500 bond.

The Judge refuses to accept a plea from [REDACTED] since he was not represented by an attorney and his parents were not present. Bond for him was set at \$500 and his hearing was set for July 16, 1963. A hearing for the white juveniles was to be arranged for next week. Hearing for the Negro defendants was to be arranged between their attorney and the States Attorney when convenient.

On July 3, 1963, picketing by Negro teenagers continued at Mc Crorys and Woolworths Stores at St. Augustine. There were no incidents. There were no demonstrations of any type on July 4, 1963, at St. Augustine.

At 12:20 AM on July 2, 1963, a call was received from the St. Johns County, Florida, Sheriff's Office, advising that the residence of Doctor Robert Hayling, 8 Scott Street, St. Augustine, Florida, had been fired upon by unknown subjects. Immediately thereafter, Doctor Hayling, a local National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) spokesman, called the FBI to advise that birdshot had been fired on persons standing in his carport around midnight. He said that two persons were wounded slightly and that individuals at his home who witnessed the shooting stated that a shotgun had been fired from a 1953 Pontiac, green, with Florida tag 20W3802.

The St. Augustine Police Department advised that at approximately 1:30 AM on July 2, 1963, Deputy Sheriff [redacted] apprehended four white youths in a 1950 white Ford and in this automobile located a sawed off 20 gauge shotgun and sawed off .22 rifle. The youths are [redacted] Augustine, Florida, white male, born September 5, 1948, at Bradenton, Florida, and the owner of the 1953 green Pontiac, bearing Florida tag 20 W3802; [redacted] white male, born May 10, 1946; [redacted] white male, born December 31, 1947; and [redacted] white male, born October 8, 1943.

about 11:30 PM, July 1, 1963, while the above four individuals were riding in [REDACTED] Pontiac, they came across a Volkswagen with three Negro occupants, who "gave them dirty looks." They followed the Volkswagen which drove to the home of Doctor Robert Hayling. [REDACTED] another car drove up containing Negroes and that a tall thin Negro youth got out of this car and fired a shot either into the air or at the Pontiac. The four white youths then fled the scene and obtained a sawed off shotgun belonging to [REDACTED] and a sawed off .22 rifle belonging to Vaughn and returned to the scene where Keeny fired one shot from the shotgun into a group of Negroes standing in Doctor Hayling's driveway. They drove off and road around until apprehended.

Investigation by the St. Augustine Police Department reflected that three Negro youths were driving in Doctor Hayling's Volkswagen at approximately 8 PM, July 1, 1963, and that these Negroes were observed exchanging curses and threats with [REDACTED] who was driving his 1954 white Buick at that time. Policemen broke up this argument and sent both parties on their separate ways. There was no evidence of any drinking. Doctor Hayling was not in the car at any time during the night.

The Negroes all residing in St. Augustine, who sustained injuries are [REDACTED] age 20, [REDACTED] who received one birdshot in his left shoulder, [REDACTED] age 21, [REDACTED] received one birdshot in his chin; [REDACTED] age 17, [REDACTED] West King Street, received one birdshot each in his forehead and left arm; [REDACTED] age 25, [REDACTED] received birdshot in his forehead and a shot which passed through his left heel. The condition of the above individuals was described to the Police Department by doctors as "good and not seriously injured."

Police examination of the Pontiac revealed a dent which the subjects claim was made by a shot fired by Negroes, but no hole or bullet was found. Chief Virgil Stewart considers the incident a result of "remarks between hot headed youths;" and not connected to any demonstrations or integration activities as such.

[REDACTED] Negro male, residing at 78 Sanford Street, St. Augustine, Florida, advised the Police Department that [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] He admitted having heated words with Keeny at about 8 PM on July 1, 1963, and having been separated by Police. [REDACTED] verified [REDACTED] story of the shooting and furnished the information set out below:

When the Pontiac followed him to Doctor Hayling's house at about 11:30 PM another car driven by Negroes pulled up. The Pontiac had parked beside Hayling's house with the lights extinguished and the motor running. He observed a rock being thrown from the Pontiac and striking Hayling's house. He called to the Negroes in the other car warning them that a rock had been thrown. He recognized the Negroes in this other car as [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] got out of the automobile and it is [REDACTED] belief that he fired a few shots from a rifle either B. APPROX. into the air or into the Pontiac. [REDACTED] the white youths drove off and did not return for 45 minutes. Doctor Hayling at the time of the shooting was at his office, located at 79 Bridge Street, St. Augustine, Florida. [REDACTED] immediately notified him of the shooting, however, neither [REDACTED] nor Hayling notified any law enforcement agency at that time. [REDACTED] he was in Hayling's house when the white youths returned and believes there was an exchange of shots between the Negroes in Hayling's driveway and the white boys in the Pontiac as they drove by. [REDACTED] that the Negroes were wounded in this exchange of shots and the St. Augustine Police Department was then notified.

[redacted] age 21, [redacted] but has not yet been located by them. [redacted] who was in the automobile with Jackson [redacted] has been described above as a victim of a gunshot wound.

Doctor Hayling when interview by the Police Department claimed that he did not know that Negroes involved had guns or fired shots. He admitted that [redacted] had called him and he returned to his home before the white youths opened fire. He also told the Police Department that he did not notify them because he can "take care of himself." Hayling stated he called the Governor's Office and the Florida Highway Patrol in Tallahassee regarding the incident.

The Mayor and other city officials were present during the questioning and stated they are attempting to contain the incident and avoid racial unrest. On July 2, 1963, Reverend J. H. McKissick First Vice President of the local NAACP at St. Augustine, Florida, said that he was aware of the incident and considered it to be the action of juvenile delinquents rather than a matter of racial importance. He stated that he will make every effort to contain violence on the part of the Negroes.

On July 2, 1963, Doctor Hayling reported at about 2:30 PM he had received 2 series of telephone calls in which the message was delivered to him that "they were sorry they had missed and there will be another night." Chief Virgil Stewart has stated that patrols have been increased in the area of Hayling's residence for the past several nights and will continue.

On July 2, 1963, picketing of McCrory's and Woolworth's by NAACP teenagers continued. There were no incidents.

Robert Andreu, City Attorney, St. Augustine, Florida, advised that the St. Augustine City Commission met on June 28, 1963, to hear petitions of the local National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP). The meeting was conducted in a harmonious and quiet atmosphere. The spokesman for the NAACP was a Mr. Shaw, an attorney who gave his address as 411 Broad Street, Jacksonville, Florida.

NAACP requested to be advised as to why they had been barred from the public library and the city owned golf putting course. The commissioners responded that this was a misunderstanding on the part of the operators and that all city facilities have been desegregated. The operators of the library and the putting course have been instructed by the commission to admit anyone regardless of race. The commissioners also stated that city jobs are open to all upon application and race would not be a factor.

NAACP requested that the commission appoint a bi-racial committee and take a definite stand on the racial situation. The commissioners advised that they did not feel a bi-racial committee was necessary and that the city had desegregated everything under their control. It was the opinion of the commissioners that the problem was now between the Negroes and private businesses as to further desegregation.

The commissioners also passed an ordinance limiting the size of signs used by picketers and prohibiting loitering or barring entrance to business establishments.

After the meeting, Dr. Robert Hayling, a local spokesman for NAACP, requested Mayor Joseph Shelley to reconsider appointment of a bi-racial committee. Shelley reiterated the commissioner's decision and Hayling remarked that "Something had to be done," but made no threats of demonstrations.

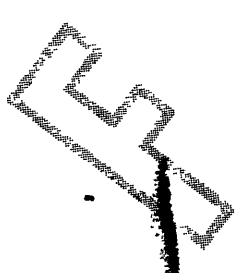
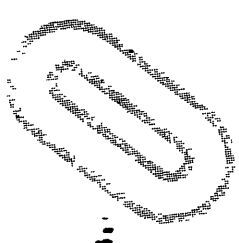

In Orlando, Florida, picketing continued at Publix Super Market store number 12, on July 13, 1963. There were no incidents.

Twenty local Negroes appeared at the municipally owned beach, Lake Wales, Florida, on July 13, 1963. [redacted] a 23-year-old white man, and [redacted] an 18-year-old Negro, argued about integration at the beach and then engaged in a fist fight. Both were arrested for fighting and disturbing the peace. The beach was then closed by the police and will reopen on July 15, 1963.

The United Florida Ku Klux Klan held a meeting at Lake Butler on the night of July 13, 1963, which was attended by approximately 400 people including 75 robed Klansmen. A speaker announced that a large Klan meeting will be held Saturday, July 20, 1963, at Bull Street, Forest Park, Savannah, Georgia. All Klansmen were urged to attend and participate in a march through Savannah. What was described as a minor fist fight took place between several spectators at the meeting. This was brought under control by the police and other spectators.

Negro members of the local National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) Youth Council picketed McCrory's and F. W. Woolworth's Stores in St. Augustine, Florida, on July 13, 1963. No incidents were reported.

A parade sponsored by the NAACP was held in Panama City, Florida, on July 13, 1963. Eighty-eight Negroes, many of whom were teen-agers and children, participated. Police provided an escort for the parade and there were no incidents reported.

Picketing continued without incident at several eating places in Ocala, Florida, on July 13, 1963.

The Florida Theater, Tallahassee, Florida, was picketed by ten Negroes and four white persons on July 14, 1963. No incidents were reported and there were no arrests.

Three Negroes and three white persons again picketed the Florida Theater on July 14, 1963, without incident.

The Student Group for Equal Rights picketed the College Inn and the local NAACP Youth Council picketed the Humpty Dumpty Restaurant in Gainesville, Florida, on July 13 and 14, 1963. No incidents were reported.

It has previously been reported that two brothers named [redacted] who were said to be members of the American Nazi Party and who were alleged to be experienced in the handling of explosives, were in the Tampa, Florida, area. The [redacted] brothers apparently are identical with [redacted] Florida, who have been described as [redacted] and fervent segregationists. They were formerly associated with the National White American Party and [redacted] has signed letters indicating membership in the American Nazi Party but later said that this had been done in jest. Confidential sources and local law enforcement agencies have been unable to develop evidence that either of the [redacted] is experienced in the handling of explosives. [redacted] according to rumor, carries one or more weapons in a satchel and local police intend to examine the satchel when [redacted] is next seen carrying it. The activities of the [redacted] brothers are being closely followed.

[redacted] if the demonstrators were arrested, there would be a mass meeting at Winter Haven City Hall on July 12, 1963. b7d

Chief of Police Munsey Smith, Winter Haven, Florida, advised that three Negroes were arrested July 10, 1963, for trespassing when they refused to leave Morrison's Cafeteria after being denied service. The warrant was obtained by James I. Mizell, Manager of the cafeteria. Nine Negroes were arrested for trespassing at Morrison's Cafeteria at 6:30 p.m., July 11, 1963. Three of the group were juveniles and were taken to the Polk County Juvenile Home. Six of the group were adults and were placed in jail in lieu of \$50 bond each. Mr. Mizell also signed the warrant for the arrests on July 11, 1963.

In Saint Augustine, Florida, Negro members of the local NAACP Youth Council picketed at McCrory's and F. W. Woolworth's stores on July 11, 1963. No incidents were reported.

Eighteen Negro youths staged a sit-in demonstration at F. W. Woolworth's store in Panama City, Florida, on July 11, 1963. [redacted] a 16-year-old Negro, sat down beside [redacted] a motel owner of Panama City Beach. [redacted] struck the [redacted] boy in the face with his open hand and was immediately arrested by the Panama City Police Department. [redacted] entered a plea of guilty to a charge of assault and battery and paid a \$15 fine. B approx 14 b7c

Chief of Police Thomas McAuley, Panama City, said that the NAACP in Panama City has lost control of the situation. He related that three Negroes came to his office on July 11, 1963, and demanded a permit to parade and demonstrate along almost the entire length of the

main thoroughfare at 4:00 p.m., July 13, 1963. Chief McAuley told the Negroes he would be happy to give them a permit to parade and demonstrate any place other than the main thoroughfare and would provide police to escort them to City Hall. The Negroes said that that was not what they wanted and that they wanted to parade and demonstrate in the main business district. Chief McAuley pointed out that this would result in violence and they replied that they were aware of that and would welcome violence.

Chief McAuley said he cannot allow a parade or demonstration on the main thoroughfare when traffic is heavy because it would almost certainly result in violence or traffic fatalities. He stated that he will therefore not issue a permit and will arrest the demonstrators if they persist in such a demonstration without a permit.

A representative of the local NAACP Youth Council, Gainesville, Florida, advised that picketing would be undertaken at the Humpty Dumpty Restaurant and the College Inn. [redacted] a white student at the University of Florida who was participating in the picketing of the Humpty Dumpty Restaurant, was struck in the face and knocked to the ground twice by [redacted] a white male aged 60. [redacted] white student at the University of Florida, stood in front of the Humpty Dumpty Restaurant making indecent gestures at the patrons inside. *b7c* *Page 12/11*

[redacted] were arrested and charged with disorderly conduct. Trial has been set for July 30, 1963.

Racial matters - Jacksonville

Three Negroes attempted to enter a public pavilion at a municipal beach, Clearwater Beach, Florida, to change clothes for swimming. They were refused admittance by three white men who were not employees of the pavilion. The beach in question has been integrated and Negroes have been using it for several months without incident.

As the Negroes left the pavilion they were followed by a jeering crowd of 30 to 50 people. Additional police arrived and prevented any trouble. Cleveland Insko, a City Commissioner who was at the beach with his family, suggested to the Negroes that they leave because of the circumstances. The Negroes' car was followed by a white man who allegedly directed obscene remarks and threats of violence at the Negroes. [redacted] was arrested on a charge of disorderly conduct and will appear in local court on July 22, 1963.

Picketing by the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People in Ocala, Florida, has been discontinued pending a meeting of the Ocala Biracial Committee on July 18, 1963.

At Lake Wales, Florida, the beach which was closed on July 13, 1963, when a fight occurred between a Negro and a white man, was reopened on July 15, 1963. No incidents were reported.

On July 15, 1963, Negroes continued to picket selected stores, theaters and restaurants at Orlando, Bradenton, Winter Haven, St. Augustine and Gainesville, Florida. No incidents or arrests were reported.

Small groups of Negroes continued to picket the coffee shop of the Ocala Hotel, Ditting's Drugstore and Padgett's Drive-in, Ocala, Florida, on July 9, 1963. No incidents occurred and there were no arrests.

[redacted], a white male, was arrested on charges of simple assault by the Saint Petersburg, Florida, Police Department on July 9, 1963. The arrest was based upon the complaint of [redacted] of the local NAACP, who alleged that on July 9, 1963, when picketing was in progress at the Florida Theater, [redacted] made rude remarks, told her to get off the sidewalk and hit her in the face with a piece of paper.

[redacted] was released on a fifty dollar bond for appearance in City Court on July 10, 1963. He gave his age as fifty-three but the police department has advised that he is at least seventy years of age.

The following information has been telephonically furnished to the Civil Rights Division.

In Saint Augustine, Florida, Negro members of the local National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) Youth Council continued the picketing at McCrory's and F. W. Woolworth's stores on July 12, 1963. The picketing was orderly and no incidents were reported.

Chief of Police Thomas McAuley, Panama City, Florida, advised that after a conference with city officials it was decided that a permit would be issued to a Negro group to parade on July 13, 1963, through the main business district of Panama City.

Chief of Police Thomas Petty, Lake Wales, Florida, advised his department was notified by local NAACP leaders that integration of the beach at Lake Wales, which began on July 11, 1963, would continue on a day-to-day basis. He related that following his receipt of this notice, 35 to 40 Negroes appeared at the beach and swam and used the picnic tables. There were no incidents reported.

In Ocala, Florida, small groups of Negroes tested the eating facilities at the Marion Hotel Coffee Shop, Fosse's Restaurant and Court Pharmacy at noon on July 12, 1963. According to Chief of Police Kenneth C. Alverez, Ocala, the Negroes were denied service and when they refused to leave, the managements called the Ocala Police Department. Chief Alverez advised he confronted each Negro group, asked them to leave, and all groups did so peacefully with no incidents reported.

Small Negro groups conducted picketing of the Ocala Hotel Coffee Shop, Ditting's Drugstore number one, and Padgett's Drive-In during the lunch hour and early afternoon hours on July 12, 1963, and no incidents were reported. An Ocala biracial group had an organizational meeting on the afternoon of July 11, 1963, and scheduled their next meeting for July 18, 1963.

Chief of Police Munsey Smith, Winter Haven, Florida, advised that the six adult Negroes arrested on July 11, 1963, at Morrison's Cafeteria were released on \$50 bond on July 12, 1963, and are scheduled to appear in local court on July 16, 1963. There was no picketing of City Hall on July 12, 1963.

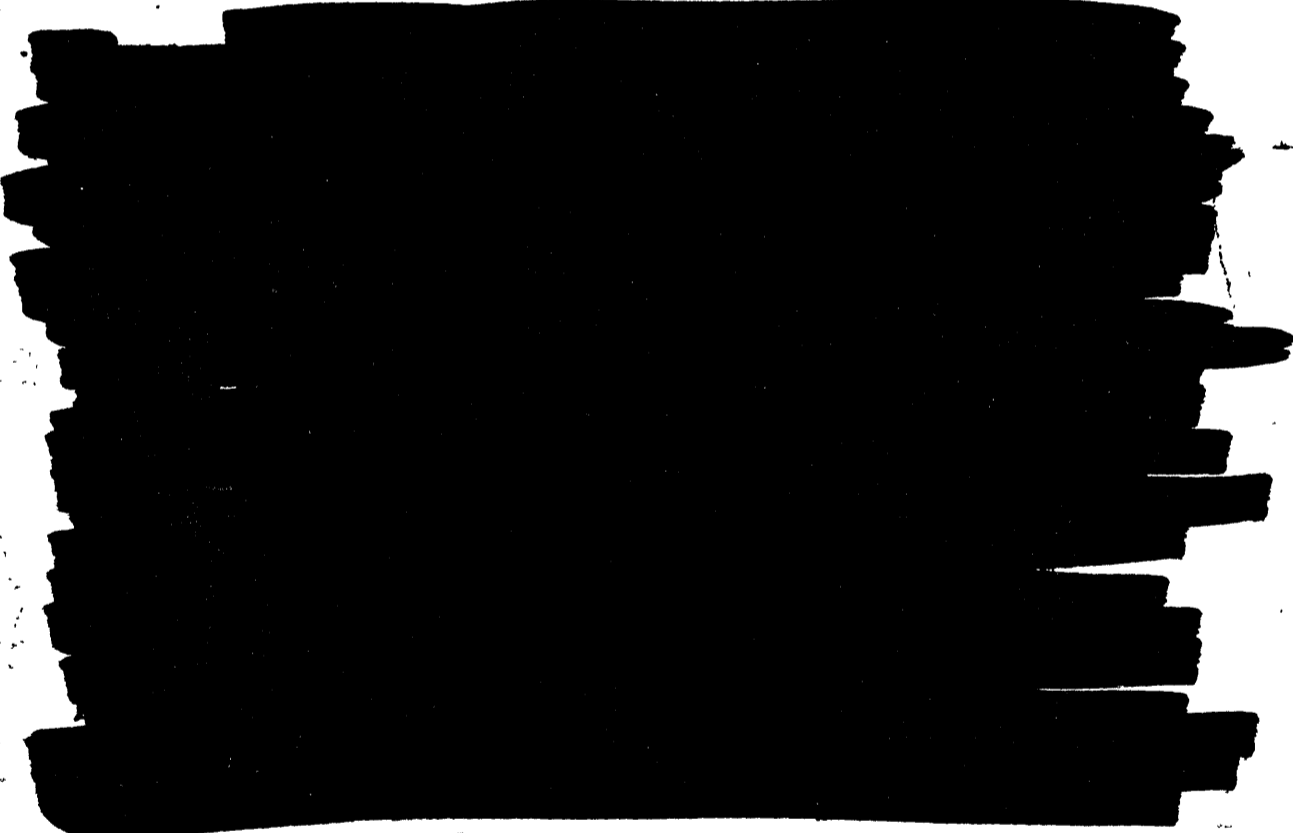
Dispatcher [redacted] Winter Haven Police Department, advised the NAACP set up a mobile picket line consisting of 14 young Negro men, each carrying a sign, on the public sidewalk in front of Morrison's Cafeteria about 4:00 p.m., July 12, 1963. At about 6:00 p.m., approximately 24 young white men gathered and briefly started pushing the pickets off the sidewalk but the police department immediately established order and the picketing continued. At about 7:45 p.m. prior to [redacted] scheduled closing, the young white men returned and pushed the pickets off the sidewalk and into the street. The police, who had been monitoring the situation from one block away, arrived before any additional incidents took place and the Negroes discontinued picketing and departed.

Picketing continued on July 12, 1963, at Publix Super Market store number twelve, Orlando, Florida, and no incidents were reported.

Picketing of the Humpty Dumpty Restaurant, Gainesville, Florida, by the local NAACP Youth Council and of the College Inn by the Student Group for Equal Rights was conducted on July 12, 1963, without incident.

The Attorney General

The Florida Theater, Tallahassee, Florida, was picketed by a group composed of approximately four Negro and eleven white students on July 12, 1963. The pickets carried signs which read, "With Justice for All" and "Freedom Now." The police maintained a close watch and kept traffic moving, and there were no arrests or incidents.



Investigation is continuing to identify and locate the [redacted] brothers and determine their activities.

Picketing by members of the Youth Council of Local National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) of Woolworths, McCrory's and a drug store continued July 24, 1963, at St. Augustine, Florida. Duration of picketing was curtailed by rain in early afternoon. Sheriff L. O. Davis reported no juveniles were taken off the picket lines July 24, 1963. County Judge Charles Mathis conferred this morning with parents of seven juveniles presently in St. Johns County Jail and parents continued to refuse to comply with court's instructions regarding behavior of juveniles while on probation. Mathis has instructed juvenile officer to make arrangements to place children in state schools. Sheriff Davis expects increased demonstrations on the night of July 24, 1963 at the County Jail and is setting up road blocks to prevent any large assembly at the jail.

On July 24, 1963, Reverend Frank Pinkston, a Field Secretary for the NAACP in Florida, advised that he has been assigned to the St. Augustine area for a two week period and has approximately five more days left of this period. He stated that his primary purpose was to bring together white persons of "liberal thought" who might have some possibility of reducing segregation in the area and making it possible to negotiate without threat of violence. He said the decision of Juvenile Judge Charles Mathis was completely unsatisfactory to the NAACP since economics makes it necessary to use juveniles in demonstrations and on picket lines. In his opinion Mathis' decision was a move geared to discourage demonstrations and any further progress by the NAACP, St. Augustine, Florida. Reverend Pinkston stated he did not know whether a large demonstration would be conducted on the night of July 24, 1963, at the St. Johns County Jail since he had not yet conferred with the parents of the juveniles confined therein.

Dr. Robert B. Hayling, Advisor to Youth Council, National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), St. Augustine, Florida, advised that seven juvenile members are still confined in St. Johns County Jail. After the July 23, 1963, demonstration at the jail, six or seven Negro adults remained on the scene throughout the day, July 24, 1963, to ascertain when or if juveniles were moved. He complained that at about 5:30 p.m. July 24, 1963, they were arrested by Sheriff L. O. Davis. He alleged that Judge Charles Mathis refused to release the juveniles unless they and their parents promised that the juveniles would refrain from demonstrating or picketing while on probation. It is his understanding probation would continue until their 21st birthday. He said picketing is a form of freedom of speech, therefore, the juvenile's civil rights were being violated by Judge Mathis' decision. He stated NAACP lawyers were handling the matter. Dr. Hayling also reported to Juvenile Officer Fred Brinkhoff that a 10 year old boy was observed on the picket line at the Florida East Coast Railroad Company presently being struck. Members of the local NAACP observed that the boy was taken to his parents rather than to the juvenile officer in direct contrast to the handling of Negro juvenile picketers. He feels that the Attorney General should take some action to stop above injustices. He said he had been in contact with the Miami correspondent of "Times" Magazine who, Dr. Hayling claims, expressed amazement at Judge Mathis' ruling. Dr. Hayling claims he would make every effort to avoid violence, but that parents of the juveniles wanted their children released. He said the course of action had not been decided.

On July 23, 1963, the seven juvenile Negroes arrested at lunch counter sit-ins on July 18, 1963, at St. Augustine, Florida, were given a hearing before Juvenile Court Judge Charles Mathis. They had been taken into custody on a trespassing charge.

Judge Mathis advised that the juveniles had defied the court by refusing to agree to obey all laws and that their parents also refused to cooperate in this regard. Judge Mathis, at great length, advised all of the juveniles and their parents that he would release them on probation if they would obey the law and not participate in demonstrations. Upon their refusal of these conditions, he issued a hold order and the juveniles were confined in the St. Johns County Jail.

Judge Mathis then issued a court order to all local law enforcement officers to the effect that juveniles should not be allowed to participate in picket lines at St. Augustine. He advised he based this order on rumors of violence from both white and Negroes and felt that it was not safe or constructive for a juvenile to serve as a picket.

As a result of this order, five juveniles were taken from the picket lines which were in place at McCrory's and Woolworth's stores in St. Augustine and turned over to Juvenile Officer [redacted] then released the juveniles to the custody of their parents. Shortly after this incident, Doctor Robert B. Hayling called Assistant Special Agent in Charge Kenneth W. Whittaker, Jacksonville Office of the FBI, and announced that he had just completed a call to the Department of Justice concerning the St. Augustine Police Department and the Sheriff's Office.

During the course of his conversation, Dr. Hayling stated he was advisor to the Youth Council of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), St. Augustine, Florida, and that he had furnished guns to several youths in the movement. In one instance he purchased a 30-30 rifle and gave it to one of his "boys" to be used for his protection and to also protect Dr. Hayling.

In Dr. Hayling's conversation with Mr. Whittaker, he stated that although he knew that violence was not the policy of the NAACP he did not care and that violence would be his policy. He stated he placed no trust in any white law enforcement.

At approximately 4:50 P.M., July 23, 1963, Special Agent [REDACTED] to verify the appointment and was advised that he, Mr. Pinkston, would be at the FBI Resident Agency between 5:30 and 6:00 P.M., or if delayed, would call. [REDACTED] to keep the appointment and no call was received from him, [REDACTED]

Sheriff L. O. Davis, St. Augustine, Florida, advised that on July 23, 1963, Negroes began gathering at the County Jail starting at about 9:00 P.M. At 11:00 P.M.,

Sheriff Davis was called to the jail by one of his deputies when the crowd had increased to about one hundred, singing, praying Negroes who were also banging hubcaps together to create additional confusion. Sheriff Davis learned that, prior to his arrival, [REDACTED] the wife of the jailer, had been dragged from the doorway by a Negro woman and kicked in the legs. Sheriff Davis stated [REDACTED] suffered no injuries other than emotional strain. He had been unable to identify the woman responsible for the assault.

During the course of the evening, NAACP Vice President G. M. Eubanks and Youth Advisor Dr. Robert B. Hayling were present, demanding the release of the seven juveniles. Sheriff Davis advised them that it was a matter to be handled by Judge Charles Mathis and Judge Mathis instructed Sheriff Davis that it was a matter to be handled through the courts and not by demonstrations.

At approximately 12:30 A.M., July 24, 1963, the demonstration was breaking up, after Judge Mathis had agreed to a new hearing for the juveniles, however, according to Sheriff Davis, at this time television photographers from Channel 12 in Jacksonville, Florida, appeared on the scene and the Negroes resumed their demonstrations for the benefit of the cameramen, according to Sheriff Davis. He stated there was no violence and he made no arrests, but that the mood of the demonstrators was such that possibilities of a riot were ever present. He stated he expected additional demonstrations probably involving larger numbers of Negroes to take place tonight.

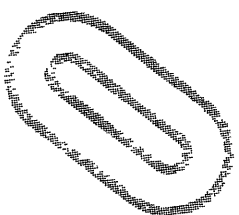

[REDACTED] Hayling has frustrated his every attempt to placate the Negro people and to assume effective leadership. He said that Hayling has telephoned all over the country to Negro and white leaders in the racial movement exaggerating racial conditions in St. Augustine by making "hysterical statements." [REDACTED] officials of the Department of Justice be advised of his evaluation of Dr. Hayling.

On July 26, 1963 the "Daytona Beach Morning Journal," the principal daily newspaper for Daytona Beach, Florida, printed an editorial highly critical of the decision of Judge Charles Mathis not to release juveniles unless they promised to refrain from picketing. It quoted a staff member of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights as stating "Can such a thing be true in this country?" A copy of the complete editorial is attached.

M. Eubanks, a Vice President of the NAACP at St. Augustine, Florida, advised that the "Daytona Beach Morning Journal" had offered to furnish copies of the above editorial to be used as the NAACP saw fit. Eubanks said that the copies were gratefully received and members of the Youth Council of the NAACP were instructed to distribute copies door to door in white neighborhoods.

At about 7:00 PM on July 26, 1963 six Negroes assigned to this distribution were arrested by the St. Augustine, Florida Police Department and charged with distributing literature on private property. Two of the Negroes were juveniles. One was immediately released to his parents and the other was held overnight. The four adults were released on July 28, 1963 under \$156 bonds with the exception of one adult whose bond was placed at \$500 since he had an additional charge against him of resisting arrest without violence.

Picketing on July 27, 1963 continued at Woolworth's, McCrory's, and two drugstores at St. Augustine, Florida. There were no incidents.

A Blight On The State's Name

A STAFF MEMBER of the U. S. Commission on Civil Rights picked up his copy of the New York Times yesterday, and began to read accounts of the nation's racial strife, and he noted the dateline of St. Augustine, Fla.

What he read made him gasp, and he put in an immediate call to the secretary of the Florida Advisory Committee. "Can such a thing be true in this country?" he demanded.

The "such a thing" was the act of County-Juvenile Judge J. Charles Mathis in St. Augustine taking seven juveniles from their parents and lodging them in the County Jail. He did so because the parents refused to sign a form the Judge presented them that said they would keep their children from indulging in any more demonstrations against segregation until they are 21.

SUCH AN ACTION as this is common under totalitarian systems. Fidel Castro has taken young children from their parents and sent them to Moscow for indoctrination. Dictators on the right and left think it is their prerogative to tell parents how to rear their children, or to restrict them in what knowledge they get or what actions they may perform.

But to think that such tactics could be exercised in the U.S.—and in its oldest city!

This ancient cradle of the new World has no right to expect that it is going to escape the drive for equality of American citizens that is being pushed down every American thoroughfare. It is doubly a target because there all the harsh methods of denial are being practiced, and are maintained by a combina-

tion of political and business power.

This fact intensified the determination of young Negroes to demand change.

The demonstrations last week were made by 16 Negro teenagers who visited a lunch counter. Wanting to keep their protest peaceful, they responded to a signal of a watcher and left the counter before a Deputy arrived. But they were arrested anyway — arrested on the street as they were walking away from the place, and charged with trespassing.

Their cases were set for last Tuesday, and it was their attorney's understanding that they would get a continuance until their regular attorney returned to the city. But, when the hearing opened, Judge Mathis presented the promise to desist forms for the seven who were under 14 — four girls and three boys. And because St. Augustine has no juvenile detention home for Negroes, they were lodged in county jail — a jail that supposedly is the place for common criminals.

FLORIDA is going to get a black eye over this case.

Big brotherism of this stripe has no place in the American system of jurisprudence. It is abhorrent for a Judge to decide he has the right to prevent young people from indulging in peaceful protest because their rights are being denied. It is a disgrace that he would take them from their parents because the parents refused to sign their rights away.

Gov. Bryant should inquire into this case immediately, and let the rest of the country know that the state does not countenance such a use of the nation's system of law.

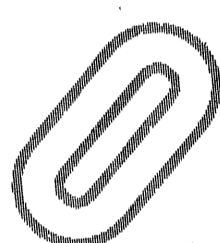
On August 9, 1963, [redacted] St. Augustine Police Department, advised his department was prevented from hiring a negro police officer by members of Dr. Robert D. Haylings' youth group. [redacted] explained for months the city has been subjected to pressure from the Local National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) to hire a negro officer. Members of the NAACP brought several applicants to the department, who were not acceptable for one reason or another. The department then considered one [redacted] an employee at the Florida East Coast Hospital for seven years, soon to lose his job because the hospital was scheduled to close. He was put through a training program, furnished uniforms and equipment, and was to be sworn in when he withdrew his application. When pressed for a reason, he explained [redacted] threatened his life if he took a job with the police department. [redacted] is a close associate of Dr. [redacted] SWINSON, who, according to [redacted], did not want [redacted] on the police force because he is an active in the NAACP.

On August 16, 1963, the Florida Advisory Committee to the United States Commission on Civil Rights, met at St. Augustine, Florida. Invitations to appear before the committee had been sent to various city and county officials, none of whom attended. The all day hearing was attended by the large group of Negroes and the Advisory Committee was addressed by several Negro leaders who complained that the City Commission had failed to set-up a bi-racial committee and take the lead in setting up talks with merchants and other groups.

Louis Mitchell of Daytona Beach, Florida, a white Episcopal Minister and Executive Director of the Florida Council on Human Relations compared conditions at St. Augustine with those in Birmingham, Alabama, before violence broke out. The commission at the end of their hearings made the following four recommendations to the United States Commission on Civil Rights:

1. That the commission seek to halt the use of \$350,000 Federal funds for promoting the St. Augustine Quadricentennial in 1965.

2. That it rule the suspension of Federal contracts for Fairchild Stratton Corporation of St. Augustine until it ends discriminatory practices and the intimidation of Negro workers.

3. That immediate steps be taken against the International Union, American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organizations (AFL-CIO), local 1224, to end discrimination.

4. That the United States withhold Federal funds from the State of Florida until it releases two minor Negro children sent to a correctional institution for participating in segregation protest.

On August 31, 1963, picketing by members of the Youth Council, National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, (NAACP) at St. Augustine, Florida, continued at Woolworth's, McCrory's, Western Auto, and two drugstores.

During the afternoon of August 31, 1963, two Negro men and two Negro women "sat-in" at St. George Pharmacy, St. Augustine, Florida, and were arrested by local authorities and charged with Trespassing After Warning. Later, eight Negroes staged a "lie-in" at the same pharmacy and were arrested. All were incarcerated in the St. Johns County Jail and were later released on bond. The arrests were without incident.

On September 2, 1963, approximately one hundred Negroes held a civil rights rally at the slave market in St. Augustine, Florida. Twenty-six males and one female, all Negroes, were arrested by the St. Augustine Police Department charged with holding a meeting without a permit. Among those arrested were Doctor Robert Hayling, Adviser to local youth group of NAACP, James Brown, a NAACP official from Savannah, Georgia, and Golda Eubanks, a Vice President of the local NAACP. Eubanks was also charged with resisting arrest.
