A BILL

Relating to the Freedmen's Bureau.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

2 That the second section of the act entitled "An act relating 3 to the Freedmen's Bureau and providing for its discontin-4 uance," passed on the twenty-fifth day of July, eighteen 5 hundred and sixty-eight, shall be so construed that the educa-6 tional department of the said bureau and the collection and 7 payment by the Commissioner of said bureau of moneys due 8 to colored soldiers, sailors, and marines, or their heirs, shall 9 be continued until the first day of January, eighteen hundred 10 and seventy-one. 11
