PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES,

TRANSMITTING

A draft of a bill to compensate any State which may abolish slavery within its limits, and recommending its passage.

JULY 14, 1862 --- Read, referred to the Committee on Finance, and ordered to be printed.

Fellow-citizens of the Senate and House of Representatives :

Herewith is a draft of a hill to compensate any State which may abolish slavery within its limits, the passage of which, substantially as presented, I respectfully and carnestly recommend.

ABRAHAM LINCOLN.

A BILL providing for the payment of persons held to service or labor liberated by any Stats.

And be it further enacted, That if any State, having so received any such bonds, shall, at any time afterwards, by law re-introduce or tolerate slavery within its limits, contrary to the act of abolishment upon which such bonds shall have been received, said bonds so received by said State shall at once be null and void in whosesoever hands they may be, and such State shall refund to the United States all interest which may have been paid on such bonds.
