

RESOLUTIONS
OF
THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF INDIANA,

IN RELATION

To the interference by Congress or State Legislatures with the domestic institutions of the Slave States.

FEBRUARY 11, 1839.

Laid on the table, and ordered to be printed.

Resolved by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, That any interference in the domestic institutions of the slave-holding States of this Union, (without their consent,) either by Congress or the State Legislatures, is contrary to the compact by which those States became members of the Union.

Resolved, That any such interference is highly reprehensible, unpatriotic, and injurious to the peace and stability of the Union.

Resolved, That a copy of this joint resolution be forwarded to each of our Senators and Representatives in Congress.
