

RESOLUTION
OF THE
LEGISLATURE OF NEW JERSEY,

IN RELATION

To the extension of slavery.

FEBRUARY 19, 1847.

Read, ordered to lie on the table, and be printed.

JOINT RESOLUTION relative to the extension of slavery in any territory which may be annexed to the United States.

1. *Resolved by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey,* That the Senators and Representatives in Congress from this State be requested to use their best efforts to secure, as a fundamental condition to or provision in any act of annexation of any territory hereafter to be acquired by the United States as an indemnity for claims, or otherwise obtained, that slavery or involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crimes, shall be forever excluded from the territory to be annexed.

2. *Resolved,* That the governor be requested to transmit a copy of the above resolution to each of our Senators and Representatives in Congress.
