

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES.

Mr. SUMNER from the Select Committee on Slavery and Freedmen, reported the following bill; which was read and passed to a second reading.

A BILL

To aid the proclamation of emancipation issued by the President on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and sixty-three.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

That the proclamation of emancipation issued by the Presi-3 dent of the United States on the first day of January, eigh-4 teen hundred and sixty-three, so far as the same declares $\mathbf{\tilde{5}}$ that the slaves in certain designated States and parts of 6 States thenceforward should be free, is hereby adopted and 7 enacted as a statute of the United States, and as a rule and 8 article for the government of the military and naval forces 9 thereof. 10
