

EXCLUSION OF SLAVERY IN TERRITORY TO BE ANNEXED TO THE
UNITED STATES.

JOINT RESOLUTIONS

OF THE

LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF OHIO,

RELATIVE

*To excluding slavery from Oregon Territory, and any other territory
which may hereafter be annexed to the United States.*

FEBRUARY 15, 1847.

Read, and laid upon the table.

Resolved by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, That the Senators and Representatives from this State in the Congress of the United States be, and are hereby, respectfully requested to procure the passage of measures in that body providing for the exclusion of slavery from the Territory of Oregon, and also from any other territory that now is or hereafter may be annexed to the United States.

Resolved, That the governor be requested to transmit to each of the Senators and Representatives from this State in the Congress of the United States a copy of the above resolution, to be by them laid before their respective Houses.
