RUSCIN also reportedly stated that he broke completely with the YSL in June, 1941.


The YOL has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

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Ene "Faily Worker", issue of February 25, 1957, page 1, column 1, contained an article which stated that BASAFD FUSCIN, Executive Secretary, War Resisters League, was one of eight non-Communist observers at the Communist Party National Convention in 1957.

The Southern Christian Leadership Conference with Headquarters in Atlanta, Georgia, is believed to lack organizetion and business finesse. This is attributed partly to a lack of policy and partly to the fact that all officers are preachers who are not skilled in certain areas. Communist infiltration of the organization at a working level was never feared, because no action could be taken without KING's approv and there was no chain of command where KING could be influenc by ideas or suggestions from the lower echelons.


The thing of concern is the possibility of a person with the wrong background or ulterior motives gaining the confidence of the subject who is believed to be extremely naive in certain areas. One such example of concern is an individual in New York City by the name of STANLEY LEVISON. LEVISON is very close to KING and has KING's confidence. LEVI is able to get KING alone and give advice to him. This advice is readily accepted by KING.

RUSTIN was on the committee to raise funds for Southern Christian Leadership Conference in New York City which at the time was known as the New York Friends of Southern Christian Leadership Conference. It is now an integral part of Southern Christian Leadership Conference but its activities are still confined mostly to the raising of money. C'DELL was on this committee as well as RUSTIN. O'DELL also was head of the New York Office of Southern Christian Leadership Conference. LEVISON has been acting mcstly as a Business Manager and has donated large amounts of mcney to KING at times when KING's finances happened to be very low.

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
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

KING said O'DELL had left Southern Christian Leadership Conference for the second time on June 26, 1963, and is no longer associated with the movement. KING called a news conference to deny a report in the "Atlanta Constitution" newspaper that C'DELL was currently employed by Southern Christian Leadership Conference in any capacity. KING acknow-ledged that O'DELL "may have had some connections in the past" with Communism but "we were convinced that he had renounced them "


The "Atlanta Constitution" described O'DELL as Director of the New York Office of Southern Christian Leadersh. Conference. A staff employee who answered the telephone in New York told United Press International that O'DELL was still with the office as "administrator" of the New York operation. However, later in the day the same office said he was not connected with the agency and had no knowledge of his whereabouts.




the Communist role in the HIML organization was raised because of HIMLER PINTS O'DELL who had held a post in Kirje's organization. However, O'DELL was finally dropped when KINC was warned by U. S. Covernment officials that he was the genuine article. Official warnings have again been given to KINC about another even more important associate who is known to be a key figure in the covert apparatus of the Communist Party. ALCOP stated that after the warnings, KINF broke off his open connection with this man but a second-hand connection nonetheless continues.




On April 17, 1964, KING was in contact with CLARENCE JONES regarding the ALSOP article. JONES stated that he had given very serious thought to the problem and said he wanted KINC to give some serious consideration to asking for an appointment with BURKE MARSHALL of the Justice Department. JONES said he suggested something like this because he did not feel it would be wise if an impression was conveyed that KINC did not have any reaction to this article and that he did nothing positive about it. JONES said he felt the article was "a kind of warning from the administration" and he thought because of this it may require some affirmative ' response on KING's part. According to JONES, the purpose of the conference with MARS-ALL would be to set the record straight as to the extent of the contacts with the individual (STANLEY LEVISON) about whom there is some concern and the reason for this contact during a limited period of time. KIN: asked whether JOVES had talked to LECISON about it and JINES said that he had. JINES stated that LECISON felt very strongly about KING seeing BURKE MARSHALL. JINES said LEVISON felt the situation required some affirmative type response on KINI's part so the Department would not feel that KING does not care.


UNES further stated that he felt because of the history surrounding O'DELL "because there have been conferences with the Justice Department, they had been very concerned and they may be getting a lot of misleading information which causes them to be disturbed about you." CONES said that if there is any question about the extent of KINN's association with LETIN'N and C'DELT, then it can be said that during the transition period while O'DELL's responsibilities were being shifted to ADELE KANDER (an employee of the New York Southern Christian Leadership Conference Office) it was












100-ΞA PRN: clt INFLUENCE RETARDING KING'S CONTACTS WITH THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES KING advised CLARENCE JONES on November 30, 1963, that he would meet JONES and HARRY WACHIEL at the Washington, D. ____, Airport to discuss what he, KING, would say to President JOHNSON. KINC advised JONES that he was meeting with the President at 11:30 a.m. on December 3, 1963. KINC said he would fly back to New York City with JONES and WACHTEL. と(!) STANLEY LEVISON on December 6, 1963, told his brother, ROY BENNET,, that he had accidentally met KING in New York City on the day that KING had met with President JOHNSON. LEVISON said he was getting into the taxi cab when KING recognized him. He related that they had a "long minutes discussion" about KING's meeting with the President. LEVISON commented that KINC is a poorly read man who probably has_not looked in a book in twenty years. LEVISON stated that he had to tell KING to write a letter to President KENNEDY at the time of the Cuban crisis complimenting him for giving . orders to his staff not to consider the outcome of the Cuban crisis as an American or allied victory. AUBREY WILLIAMS JCHN BUTLER of Dallas, Texas, identified in testimony before the United States Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on March 19, 1954, at New Orleans, Louisiana, as a former Communist Earty member, testified That he was introduced to AUBREY/WILLIAMS in 1942 as ... ("Comrade Williams", that he participated with WILLIAMS in a "conference" of communist affairs about one month later, and had heard WILLIAMS mentioned often as a Communist. PAUL CROUCH, identified at the same hearing as a -former Communist Party organizer, testified thathe was introduced to WILLIAMS by HERBERT BENJAMIN, whom he identified as a charter member of the Communist Party as one of the "Chief National Leaders". CRCUCH further testified that he would not have made statements to WILLIAMS unless "I had been informed that he was a secret member."

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On September 23, 1963, STANLEY LETISON discussed the forthcoming book that is being written by the subject. LEVISON advised that this book dealt with KINC's experiences in Birmingham, Alabama, as well as other matters and is being handled in part by CLARENCE JONES. LEVISON is not satisfied with the manner in which JONES has been handling some of the material for the book, and he intends to speak to JONES in this regard. LEVISON has prepared the Forward to this book which will be approximately a page and a half long.

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
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On September 30, 1963, the subject held a discussion with CLARENCE JONES regarding his book. The subject advised JONES that he wants his book published as soon as possible. JONES remarked that he had checked on the publishing date and the bock would not be published intil 1964.

On October 5, 1963, the subject asked the wife of CLARENCE JONES whether CLARENCE and. "his friend" could meet with him at the subject's hotel. Later on the same date subject spoke with JONES and they discussed the recordings of subject's speech at the recent "March on Washington". Arrangements were then made between the subject and JONES to meet at the Park Sheraton Hotel, New York City, on October 5, 1963. The subject asked JONES if "our friend" would be coming with him. JONES said that he would because they wanted to discuss the subject's book with him.

J NES later contacted STANLEY LE, ISON and advised him that he had met with the subject and arrangements had been made for all of them to meet. LE/ISON agreed to attend the meeting.

On October 8, 1963, ALISS LOEWI, a business standing associate of SCANLEY LEVISON inquired as to how LEVISON'S day with KIY, had been. LEVISIN told LOEWI that it had



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been a good day but added "you know I'm not going to be seeing him, but I have to finish off this book thing that was started". LEVISON said that he did not want to maintain contact and yet it was an obligation that he had taken. LEVISON did not say why he was having no further contact with KING.

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
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
LEVISON on November 18, 1963, was requested by a representative of the publishers of KIN3's book to talk with KING and CLARENCE JONES about the editing of the book. LEVISON agreed to this adding that JONES does not have enough contact with KING to determine what KING's real complaints and desires are.


CLARENCE JONES contacted LEVISON on November 19, 1963, and they discussed KING's book. JONES said KING was not satisfied with the editing job which had been done and JONES suggested that he and LEVISON would have to see KING in order to get all of the problems straightened out, ever if it meant going to Atlanta, Ceorgia, to do it.

CLARENCE JONES and STANLEY LEVISON planned to meet XINC at the International Hotel at Idlewild Airport, New York, on November 20, 1963, at 11:00 a.m. It was indicated that KINC would be leaving New York taking a 3:00 p.m. flight to Chicago.

On November 20, 1963, Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed KIN. and his assistant BERNARD LEE entering the International Hotel Idlewild Airport, Queens, New York, at 10:43 a.m. LEE, after inquiring about a room in the hotel, registered and was given Room 311. KING and LEE took the elevator to the Unird Floor. At 2:40 p.m. on November 20, 1964, Special Agents observed KING departing from the International Hotel in the company of LEVISON and JONES. Outside of the hotel FINC and LEE entered one cab and JONES and LEVISON entered another.







0 AT 100-55 6 RFr:elt In December 5, 1963, BAYARD RUL IN contacted KING. RUSINN informed KING that on December 13, 1963, at O.CO p.m. Senator ISEFH CLARK and "a couple of other intellectuals" were to speak at a conference in New York on peace, civil rights and labor. RUSTIN said that it was being put on by a "bunch of intellectuals under 'Iurn Doward Peace'. RUSTIN said they would like to have KING speak at this affair and told KING that he would get \$500 for himself, not for the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, if he would speak. EUSLIN said that the affair on December 13, 1963, would be held at the Carnegie Center in New York City. RUSTIN said they wanted him to speak on the relationships between civil rights and peace or on peace as KINI sees it. PUSIIN offered to help KING by "jotting down a few things." It is not known whether FING participated in this activity. Cn December 6, 1963, BAYARD RUSCIN mentioned to RACHELLE L'ROWITZ that he was trying to raise some money for her. (It is to be noted that HOROWIEZ was Transportation Director for the "March on Washington".) RUSCIN said that HOROWIEZ was supposed to go to Mississippi to do a job for the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNUC). RUSPIN mentioned that he was trying to raise a thousand dollars to pay for HOROWICZ's expenses. RUSTIN mentioned that by having her work down there HOROWITZ can supply him information on the day-to-day operations, which would be impossible to get in any other way. RUSTIN said that HCROWITZ knows the kind of information that he wanted since she helped him write speeches for KIN3. ァ RACHELLE'HORDWICZ PACHELLE HIROWING was's member of the Lew Lork -Unit of the Young Socialist League (25%) on May 22, 1958. C b() A Characterization of the Young Socialist League is Jacluded in the Appendix of this report.



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On December 11, 1963, STANLEY LEATSON contacted CLARENCE TINES about FINT's forthcoming book and during the course of the conversation LEATSON mentioned there were several chapters which should be revised and several others which require minor changes.

JONES and LEVISON also discussed an appeal letter in connection with the "Jewish Appeal". LEJISON said that he would send WIATT T. WALKER (Executive Director of Southern Christian Leadership Conference) a constructive letter on the Southern Christian Leadership Conference News Letter. JONES said that he would appreciate that.

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
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
HERMINE FOPPER was in contact with STANDEY LEVISON on December 18, 1963. She stated that JOAN DAVES had suggested that LEVISON had some ideas to talk about in connection with KIN1's forthcoming book. She said DAVES felt LEVISON had some intelligent things to say to HERMINE which would be useful before she saw KINC. LEVISON agreed and stated that he thought that because "this ground has been gone over a number of times" if he could convey "certain ideas" to HERMINE it would be even more fruitful when she sees KINQ. HERMINE/POPPER and LEVISON then agreed to meet the next day at her home_in White Plains, New York, at 240 Posedale Avenue. (It is believed that the JOAN LAVES is a publisher's representative who had been working on KINN's book and that HERMINE POPPER is-the person who was taking over the editing for the book from another employee of the publisher).




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In December 24, 1963, HERNARD LEE (Field Secretary of Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Atlanta, Jeorgia) contacted DIAFENCE JUVES and indicated that he and KIN, would










JINMINE POPPER contacted SIANIEY LEVISON on January 27, 1964, with regard to the editing of FILI's book. They discussed this book with respect to KINL's handling of President JUHYSON and LEVISON commented that FILL is hesitant to praise JUHNSON too much because he is not sure of JOHNSON's final position on Civil Rights. POPPER discussed several items which appeared on a letter of KING written while he was in jail in Birmingham, Alabama, which had not actually occurred at the time. LEVISON stated that HIN! later edited this letter and inserted the additional material. LEVISON advised POPPER to include the material but to be very general; for example, in the part about police dogs attacking six unarmed Negro children, she should omit the six and put in the rest of it. b[/) On January 29, 1964, STANLEY LEVISON told CLARENCE JONES that since the school boycott may fail because of lack of interest, BAYARD RUSDIN should contact FUNG and suggest that KINI cut tapes to be played every half hour on New York City radio station "beamed to Negroes" suggesting they boycott the schools. JUNES thought this was a great idea, and LE. ISON said he would arrange for the financing of this. LEVISON said if KINC does not have time to cut these tapes RANAED should do it. IELESIN stated that this radio technique has worked in the past and should work now. In February 1, 1964, MASENCE CLASS told MINU he would give MING the money to pay FIDMINE FIFFEP for the editing of MINU's book. JINHS and MINJ discussed the last.



JONES advised KING that their main purposes was to link preferential treatment with the struggle against poverty. MING mentioned to JIMES the treatment of President JOHNSON which is given in the book and JONES advised that LEVISON said HERMINE FOFPER felt KINC should give his personal views of JCHNSCM. CONES said this is particularly appropriate since the book will come out before the election. 6U) On Manuary 31, 1964, a representative of the publishers of FING's book contacted STANLEY LEVES N. They discussed having LEVISEA review the edited portions of EINT's book which thus far was about six chapters or about 116 pages. The representative said there were still two chapters to be finished and that the book would be out in early June. IEJISCN and the publisher's representative agreed that the book was turning into something timely and important. b(!) 
On March 31, 1964, KINE and RALPH ABERNATHY (Treasurer of Southern Christian Leadership Conference) contacted CLARENCE JONES. KENS advised JONES that financially Southern Christian Leadership Conference "is really up against it as it takes \$50,000 a month to run the SCLE". KINE said that the organization is just about broke. JENES asked KINE if Southern Christian Leadership Conference had obtained the money from ROIMAN ROJKEFELLER (the son of Tovernor NEISON ROTHEFELLER) and KING indicated the Southern Christian Leadership Conference had not received the money which it was to receive as a result of 'KINE's appearance on February 29, 1964, at a luncheon given by the Urban League of West Chester, New York. KINS also wanted to know when Southern Christian Leadership Conference would receive \$2500 from the Wandhi Society and TENES replied that he would send the money out as soon as he could get some funds from MARPY WACHTEL and "other people". JONES told KING that he would have the \$2500 for Southern Christian Leadership Conference by the following Friday. FING urged JONES to have the Gandhi Society send the \$2500 because "we are about to go out of business."

(This refers to the bombing of a Negro church in Birmingham where several Negro children were killed). JONES suggested to KIN2 that KIN3 and other civil rights leaders should issue a call to the Negro population of the Nation for a work stoppage for a period of silence at the time of the funerals for the bombing victims.

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On January 4, 1964, KINC contacted JONES. KING said that he was going to bring the financial report of Southern Christian Leadership Conference to a meeting at 10:00 a.m. on January 8, 1964, and indicated that this may help straighten out the mess in the New York Chapter of Southern Christian Leadership Conference.

Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on January 8, 1964, observed STANLEY LEVISON entering the New York Filton Hotel at 9:41 a.m. CLARENJE JONES was observed entering the hotel at 9:52 a.m. JONES and LEVISON met in the lobby and took an elevator to the 33rd flocr. At 4:59 p.m. on the same date, Agents observed KINA, STANLEY LEVISON and CLARENCE JONES departing from the New York Hilton. BERNARD LEE, WYATH T. WALKER and RALPH D. ABERNATHY were also observed departing at this time.

"On January 9, 1964, GLARENCE JONES said that it had been decided there would be a complete revamping of the New York Office of Southern Christian Leadership Conference. He mentioned it had been decided that the New York Office would be closed at its present location and move to Midtown, Manhattan.

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
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
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
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


AN 100-5580 FAIR PLAY FUR ONEA COMMINDEE The April 6, 1960, edition of "The New York Fimes"

newspaper contains a full-page advertisement captioned, "What is Really Happening in Guba", placed by the Fair Play for Guba Committee (FPCC). This advertisement announced the formation of the FPCC in New York City and declared the FFCC intended to promulgate "the truth about revolutionary Cuba" to neutralize the distorted American press.

"The New York Times" edition of January 11, 1961, reported that at a hearing conducted before the United States Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on January 10, 1961, Dr. CHARLES A. SANFOS-BUCH identified himself and ROBERT TABER as organizers of the FPCC. He also testified he and TABER obtained funds from the Cuban Government which were applied toward the cost of the afore-mentioned advertisement.

On May 16, 1963, a source advised that during the first two years of the FPCC's existence there was a struggle between Communist Party (CP) and Socialist Workers Party (SVP) elements to exert their power within the FPCC and thereby influence FPCC policy. However, during the past year this source observed there has been a successful effort by FPCC leadership to minimize the role of these and other organizations in the FPCC so that today their influence is negligible.

On May 20, 1963, a second source advised that the National Headquarters of the FPCC is located in Room 329 at 799 Broadway, New York City. According to this source, the position of National Office Director was created in the fall of 1962 and was filled by VINCENT "TED" LEE, who now formulates FPCC policy. This source observed LEE has followed a course of entertaining and accepting the cooperation of many other organizations including the OP and the SWP when he has felt it would be to his personal benefit as well as the FPCU's. However, IEE has indicated to this source he has no intention of permitting FPCC policy to be determined by any other organization. LEE feels the FPCC should advocate resumption of diplomatic relations between Cuba and the United States and support the right of Cubans to manage their revolution without interference from other nations, but not support the Juban revolution per se.



FREEDOMWAYS ASSOCIATES, INCORPORATED

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The records of the New York Secretary of Star, Albany, New York, show that the certificate of incorporation of Freedomways Associates, Incorporated, was filed on March 2, 1961.

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
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The Spring, 1963, issue of "Freedomways" is selfdescribed as "A Quarterly Review of the Negro Freedom Movement" published by Freedomways Associates, Incorporated, 799 Broadway, New York City.

On May 24, 1961, a source advised that a report was given on "Freedomways" at a meeting of the National Board, Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), held on May 24, 1961. It was stated that the original plan called for the publication to be openly Marxist, but that it was later decided it would not be avowedly a Marxist publication. Editorials are in the hands of a mixed group of Marxists and non-Marxists. It was stated that the central purpose of "Freedomways" is to develop a theory and positive criticism of currents in the Negro movement, as well as to raise the level of understanding and discussion taking place in Negro life today and to project a socialist and pro-Soviet orientation.

On May 25, 1961, another source advised that "Freedomways" was set up for the CPUSA by James Jackson, a member of the National Committee of the CPUSA.



NATIONAL COMMITTEE TO ABOLISH THE HOUSE UN-AMERICAN ACTIVITIES COMMITTE

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The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Fublications" issued December 1, 1961, by the Committee on Un-American Activities, U. S. House of Representatives, page 115, contains the following citation regarding the National Committee to Abolish the Un-American Activities Committee (NCAUAC).


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"Cited as a 'new organization' set up in the Summer of 1960 to lead and direct the Communist Party's 'Operation Abolition' campaign. Seven of the national leaders of this group have been identified as Communists."

A source has advised that the NCAUAC changed its name on March 3, 1962, to include the word "House" in its name, thereby becoming known as the National Committee to Abolish the House Un-American Activities Committee (NCAHUAC). A national meeting of this organization was held in Chicago, Illinois, on April 27 and 28, 1963.



On March 9, 1961, a source advised that the New York Council to Abolish the Un-American Activities Committee (NTCAUAC 150 West 34th Street, New York City, New York, was formed at a meeting held in New York City on November 17, 1960. This organization was founded principally through the efforts of FRANK MILKINSON, Field Representative of the National Committee to Abolish the Un-American Activities Committee (NCAUAC).

W YORK COUNCIL TO ABOLISH HE ALSE UN-AMERICAN ACTIVITIES COMMUTTE

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A second source advised on September 17, 1952, that FRANK WILKINSON was a Communist Party member as of September 1952.

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A third source furnished on September 14, 1961, a copy of resolutions of the New York Council to Abolish the House Un-American Activities Committee (NYCAHUAC) which were adopted by the NYCAHUAC. One such resolution affirmed the intention to continue to work for the abolition of the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA) and to continue its efforts to broaden the participation in this fight. Another resolution accepted as a modus vivendi the suggestion of the Field Representative of the "National Committee to Abolish the HCUA" (NCAHUAC) namely that local abolition committees may identify and co-ordinate their efforts as closely as they desire with NCAHUAC, still maintaining their autonomy for as flexible and independent a program as possible.

Various sources have advised during March, 1962, that Communist Party (CP) members in the New York City area have been solicited to support activities of the NYCANUAC during attendance at CP Club meetings.

On May 6, 1963, the first source advised that the NYCAHUAC continues to function from its office at 150 West 34th Street, New York City, New York.



NATION OF ISLAM, formerly referred to as the Muslim Cult of Islam, also known as Muhammad's Temples of Islam

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
In January, 1957, a source advised Elijah Muhammad has described his organization on a nationwide basis as the "Nation of Islam" and "Muhammad's Temples of Islam".

On July 10, 1963, a second source advised Elijah Muhammad is the national leader of the Nation of Islam (NOI); Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2,5335 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, is the national headquarters of the NOI; and in mid-1960, Muhammad and other NOI officials, when referring to Muhammad's organization on a nationwide basis, commenced using either "Mosque" or "Temple" when mentioning one of "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."


The NOI is an all-Negro organization which was originally organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan. Muhammad claims to have been selected by Allah, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America by establishing an independent black nation in the United States. Members following Muhammad's teachings and his interpretation of the "Koran" believe there is no such thing as a Negro; that the so-called Negroes are slaves of the white race, referred to as "white devils," in the United States; and that the white race, because of its exploitation of the so-called Negroes, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon."

In the past, officials and members of the NOI, including Muhammad, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Acts and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States.

On May 5, 1958, the first source advised Muhammad had, upon advice of legal counsel, tempered his versonal statements and instructions to his ministers concerning the principles of his organization in order to avoid possible prosecution by the United States Government; however, he did not indicate any fundamental changes in the teachings of his organization.

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"The Southern Patriot" was cited as an "organ" of the SOUTHERN CONFERENCE FOR HUMAN WELFARE (SCHW) by the Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 592, on the SCHW, June 12, 1947.


The SCHW was cited as a communist front by the Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 592, June 16, 1947.

An amendment to the charter of the SCHW changed the name of that organization to the SCEF, and listed its purpose as being to improve the educational and cultural standards of the Southern people in accordance with the highest American democratic institutions, traditions, and ideals. The amendment was dated April 26, 1946.


A source advised on March 2, 1961, that CLAUDE LIGHTFOOT, a Communist Party functionary, stated at a meeting of the Communist Farty in Baltimore, Maryland, on February 25, 1961, that the Communist Party is not connected with any progressive movement but indirectly they do have some influence in the SCEF.

A second source, who is familiar with some phases of Communist Party activity in the New Orleans area, advised on May 27, 1963, that during the time the SCHW was in existence, Communist Party (CP) members were members of and worked actively in the SCHW. However, since the formation of the SCEF, rank and file CP members have not been encouraged to work in the SCEF. The source stated that the SCEF is a progressive, liberal organization, which he considers a CP front organization because it has gone along with the Communist Party on certain issues, particularly on the racial question.



Che March 1, 1954, issue of the "Young Socialist Challenge," published as page three of "Lator Action," an official publication of the Independent Socialist League (ISL), contained an article concerning the creation of the YSL, which pointed out that at a unity conference occurring February 12-14, 1954, at Labor Action Hall, New York, New York, a merger occurred between the Young Peoples Socialist League (YPSL) and the Socialist Youth League (SYL). The new organization was named the YSL.


A Confidential Informant on June 15, 1954, made available the minutes of the YSL's National Action Committee meeting of April 13, 1954, which reflected that one S. SITEMAN, "Chairman of SP (Socialist Party) Youth Committee", had objected to a statement appearing in "Commerce," a New York University journal, which indicated that the YPSL merged with the SYL to form the YSL. He explained that the YPSL did not merge with anyone, that it continued to exist as the youth section of the Socialist Party. He expelled, or suspended from that organization and joined, the SYL, which he characterized as the youth group of the "Trotskyite ISL". He explained that after these few former members of the YPSL joined the SYL, the SYL then proceeded to changs its name for its own purposes.

On April 9, 1956, another confidential informant advised as follows:

The YSL has frequently worked in close sympathetic cooperation with the ISL toward similar objectives, although each major issue given mutual consideration is decided upon by these organizations individually. The YSL serves as an apprenticeship for the ISL, but ISL selection of members from YSL ranks is made on an individual and personal basis. In many instances YSL members are also members of the ISL. The YSL and ISL utilize the same printing house in New York City and the YSL publication is printed as an insert in "Labor Action". Frequently, lecturers before the USL are ISL members.

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




The records of the New York Secretary of State, Albany, New York, show that the certificate of incorporation of Freedomways Associates, Incorporated, was filed on March 2, 1961.

The Spring, 1963, issue of "Freedomways" is selfdescribed as "A Quarterly Review of the Negro Freedom Movement" published by Freedomways Associates, Incorporated, 799 Broadway, New York City.

On May 24, 1961, a source advised that a report was given on "Freedomways" at a meeting of the National Board, Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), held on May 24, 1961. It was stated that the original plan called for the publication to be openly Marxist, but that it was later decided it would not be avowedly a Marxist publication. Editorials are in the hands of a mixed group of Marxists and non-Marxists. It was stated that the central purpose of "Freedomways" is to develop a theory and positive criticism of currents in the Negro movement, as well as to raise the level of understanding and discussion taking place in Negro life-today and to project a socialist and pro-Soviet orientation.

On May 25, 1961, another source advised that "Freedomways" was set up for the CPUSA by James Jackson, a member of the National Committee of the CPUSA.






Times," a daily newspaper published in New York, New York, contained an article on page 20 which indicated that MALCOLM X (LITTLE), former national official of the Nation of Islam (NOI) and Minister of NOI Mosque #7, New York, who broke with the NOI on March 8, 1964, publicly announced in New York City on March 12, 1964, that he had formed the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI). The MMI, according to the article, would be a broadly based politically oriented black nationalist movement for Negroes only, financed by voluntary contributions. In this public statement MALCOLM X urged Negroes to abandon the doctrine of non-violence when it is necessary to defend themselves in the civil rights struggle, and he also suggested that Negroes form rifle clubs to protect their lives and property in times of emergencies in areas where the government is unable or unwilling to protect them.

Incorporation papers of the MMI filed on March 16, 1964, with the Business Section, Clerk of Courts, New York County, New York, New York, reflect that the MII was incorporated under the Religious Corporation Law of the State of New York to work for the imparting of the Islamic Faith and Islamic Religion in accordance with "accepted Islamic principals." The principal place of worship to be located in the Borough of Manhattan, New York, New York.

During an appearance over KYW - Television, Cleveland, Ohio, on April 7, 1964, MALCOLM X stated that the MMI does not stand for integration, but for complete freedom, justice, and equality for Negroes. He stated that Islam was the religious philosophy of the MMI, while the political, economic and social philosophy was black nationalism.

On May 15, 1964, a confidential source advised that the headquarters of the MMI are located in Suite 128, Hotel Theresa, 2090 Seventh Avenue, New York City, where they were






In January, 1957, a source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD has described his organization on a nationwide basis as the "Nation of Islam" and "Muhammad's Temples of Islam".

(n July 10, 1963, a second source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD is the national leader of the Nation of Islam (NOI); Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2,5335 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, is the national headquarters of the NOI; and in mid-1960, MUHAMMAD and other NOI officials, when referring to MUHAMMAD's organization on a nationwide basis, commenced using either "Mosque" or "Temple" when mentioning one of "Muhammad's Temples of-Islam".

The NOI is an all-Negro organization which was originally organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan, MUHAMMAD claims to have been selected by Allah, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America by establishing an independent black nation in the United States. Members following MUHAMMAD's teachings and his interpretation of the "Koran" believe there is no such thing as a Negro; that the so-called Negroes are slaves of the white race, referred to as "white devils", in the United States; and that the white race, because of its exploitation of the so-called Negroes, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon".



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
According to Jones, in his speech King will suggest that the Republican Party consider the following: compliance with the Civil Rights Bill, police brutality and the harassment of civil rights workers, and automation and unemployment. Jones stated that King will suggest under compliance with the Civil Rights Bill that the President make use of his powers by appointing United States Marshals to observe in the offices of voter registration in any problem areas and to accompany to the office of voter registration any group of five or more persons who have been-threatened, and supplementing this he will recommend that the powers of the United States Department of Justice and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) be more 'vigorously and creatively employed.


The date Mosque #7 originated in New York City is not known.

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




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
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



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Negro organizations specifically named in the injunction was the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), of which MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. is president. Racial disturbances took place in Selma, Ala. 7/3 - 9/64 in connection with a voter registration demonstration and the testing of the Civil Rights Act Of 1964. Over 70 Negroes, and 6 whites, were arrested by the Dallas County Sheriff's Office in connection with this activity.

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
Negro groups called off their demonstrations on 7/10/64, after the injunction was issued, and on 7/11/64 petitioned the U.S. District Court, Mobile, Ala., to remove to federal court the cases involving the persons arrested in connection with the demonstrations. It was also requested that the Sheriff's Department be restrained from arresting Negroes in connection with voter registration activities.

On 7/13/64, U. S. District Judge DANIEL H. THOMAS, Mobile, Ala., assumed jurisdiction over the persons arrested in Selma, Ala., but denied the writ of injunction asked for. The attorney signing the petitions filed on behalf of the Negro organizations was PETER A. HALL, of Birmingham, Ala., although they were presented by HENRY M. ARONSON, 151 Farmington, Hartford, Connecticut, and CHARLES H. JONES, JR., a Negro male, who indicated he is an attorney in the firm of JACK GREENEERG, 10 Columbus Circle, New York, New York.

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
The "Long Island Press" of Monday, July 20, 1964, contains an article captioned "Violence Not Path To Equality: King" written by Percy Watson. In the article, it was stated that Martin Luther King, Jr., made a speech at the Hollywood Baptist Church, North Amityville, Long Island, New York, on July 19, 1964, where he was the guest of the Laymen's League of the church. According to the article, King made a plea for non-violence in the struggle by Negroes for equality and instructed them to work untiringly for first class citizenship, but never use second class methods to attain it." During the course of his talk, King mentioned that his visit to North Amityville was a brief break from the international states and the states of the day-to-day struggle for liberty in the South. ۰. ۲.



King pointed out, in his speech, that the Negro people are engaged in a frustrating, crisis-packed struggle, and he summed up their demands by saying "we want all the rights, we want them here, and we want them now". He said, "the great danger is the atom bomb in the hearts of men, which can explode in a disaster of hate".

According to the article, among those to greet King 1.114 at the 700 seat/church, which was crowded to overflowing was Rev. W. Robert/Hampshire, Rector, St. Thomas Episcopal Church, Farmingdale, who recently returned from a civil rights demonstration in St. Augustine, Florida, where he was struck on the head during the melee. Father Hampshire referred to King as the "greatest man of our time". Reverand Andy C. Lewter, Pastor of the Hollywood Baptist Church called King the "Messiah of the Twentieth Centry".


