Rosen SUBJECT: RACIAL SITUATION SELMA, ALABAMA - NICELLE CRACIAL MATTERS Negro youths in Selma, Alabama, have been conducting sit-ins, picketing demonstrations and attending youth rallies since 9-16-63 under the leadership of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC). The youth rallies have been held at the First Baptist Church in Selma. Our Mobile Office has been observing this racial activity at the request of the Civil Rights Division. STORENT ROW WILLIAM COOL WILLIAM OF On 9-24-63 an informant of the New York Office advised that Clarence Jones, National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) attorney in New York had been informed that John Lewis, SNCC representative, and about 1,400 Negroes were surrounded in the First Baptist Church in Selma by local and state police and citizens summoned by the Sheriff, and further, that the minister of the church and Worth Long had already been dragged out of the church. It was indicated that telegrams concerning the situation were going to be sent to President Kennedy, the Attorney General and Assistant Attorney General Burke Marshall. Mr. John Murphy, Civil Rights Division, advised that the Department had received similar information from the NAACP in Washington on 9-24-63 and that Lewis claimed that 1,000 Negroes had been in the church since the night of 9-23-63, that the church was surrounded by State Troopers and deputized citizens and that Negroes were being prevented from leaving the church. 157-6-61-351

Information was previous preceived from the Hobite Office concerning the youth rally held at the First Baptist Church on the evening of 9-23-63 and Agents observed that the meeting ended at 11:00 p.m. (Central Standard Time) that date at which time all of those in attendance departed from the church. No violence occurred and the police who were at the scene did not interfere with their departure, although at the request of 1 - Mr. Mohr 1 - Mr. DeLoach 1 - Mr. Evans

Sheriff James Clark approximately 50 Alabama State Troopers drove around the church in caravan style in a show of force. The only other incident was the moving of about 200 of the Negroes from the main auditorium of the church to the basement by the Fire Department as a safety measure because of the overcrowding of the main auditorium well beyond its legal capacity of 350.

Another Negro youth rally was held at the church beginning at 8:00 a.m. 9-24-63 with approximately 400 Negroes in attendance. The majority of Negro youths involved are students at the R. B. Hudson High School in Selma. Approximately 20 law enforcement officers including city police, sheriff's deputies and Dallas County posse members were at the scene but there were no Alabama State Police on duty at the church. Bureau Agents observed that the Negroes were allowed to come and go as they desired from the church in small groups throughout the day.



Later in the afternoon, 600 to 700 Negro youths left the Hudson High School and proceeded in the direction of the First Baptist Church in groups. The members of one group of approximately 30 to 40 youths who were singing freedom songs were arrested by local police and charged with unlawful assembly. Shortly after, a group of 100 youths, who left the First Baptist Church and marched down the street, were stopped by local police. The youths knelt on the street and sang at which time they were placed under arrest and charged with parading without a permit. All of those arrested, a total of 139, were transported to jail in buses. Bureau Agents observed no incidents of brutality occurring in their presence in connection with the arrests.

The arrests of the Negro youths took place immediately adjacent to a Negro housing project and approximately 50 Alabama State Troopers arrived on the scene and notified all residents

who were in their yards or on the sidewalks viewing the arrests to go into their homes. They forced Negroes off the streets into their residences.

The Negroes arrested, all of whom are juveniles, were taken to Camp Selma, a state prison road camp on the outskirts of Selma

Youth activity at the church ceased at about 5:45 p.m. The only later activity at the church on the evening of 9-24-63 was a meeting of approximately 75 Negro adults. This meeting ended at 10:00 p.m. and no incidents or violence occurred.




Throughout the morning of September 25, 1963, groups of Negro youths were observed going in and out of the First Baptist Church, corner of Jeff Davis Avenue and Sylvan Street, Selma, Alabama, by a Bureau Agent. There were no law enforcement officers observed stationed around the scene at the church and very little activity occurred. At about 1:00 p.m. C.S.T. information was received by radio that activity was beginning to form around the First Baptist Church. Also radio traffic carried information that picketing would take place at the City Hall or the Dallas County Courthouse. It was observed that Negroes were leaving the First Baptist Church in twos and threes and dispersing in various directions from the church.

The assembly at the church was estimated at 12:40 p.m. C.S.T. at approximately 100 Negroes. There were about 50 local police officers around the scene which were all local police department officers, sheriff's deputies and posse members. No Alabama State Troopers were present on

the immediate scene. Twenty-three Alabama Highway Patrol Trooper cars were parked at the National Guard Armory, Highway 22, South, Selma. According to radio traffic and observation by Agents, Colonel AL LINGO was in Selma and in command of a force of State Troopers numbering about 50 men. At about 2:00 p.m., C.S.T. picketing began in front of the Dallas County Courthouse by Negroes who appeared to be adult Negroes and not juveniles. Sheriff JAMES G. CLARK, JR. was on the scene; police department officers and 25 to 30 posse members were on standby inside the Dallas County Courthouse. The pickets were allowed to picket for about 10 minutes. The Alabama State Troopers appeared on the scene, alighted from cars, and formed a line in the middle of Alabama Avenue in front of the Dallas County Courthouse. They were armed with clubs and sidearms No carbines or shotguns were displayed by the Troopers or local authorities at the scene, Photographs were obtained of the picketers and law enforcement officers at the scene. After about 10 minutes of picketing, Sheriff JAMES G. CLARK, JR. announced over the public address system in his car that he was arresting them for "Unlawful Assembly and Inciting to Riot". The pickets' signs were confiscated, they were marched onto a bus, and taken to jail.

activity was taking place and as of 5:00 p.m. C.S.T. only about 50 Negroes remained congregated at the church but no meeting was taking place and activities were at a standstill.

On September 25, 1963,

advised that a meeting was taking place at the First Baptist Church at 8:30 p.m. He stated that some 400 to 500 Negroes were in attendance at the church and they were singing songs and listening to speakers.

At 10:45 p.m. C.S.T. advised that the meeting had terminated at 10:30 p.m. and the Negroes had dispersed peacefully and gone to their homes. No violent activities had taken place and no other incident had been reported.



On September 26, 1963. and

advised periodically throughout the day that no activity was taking place in Selma with the exception that Negro youths had begun congregating around the Brown's Chapel AME Church on Sylvan Street at approximately 7:00 AM (CST) and small groups came in and out of the church during the day.


Bureau agents observed at about 3:00 PM (CST) at R. B. Hudson High School that it appeared Negroes were holding a rally inside the school and singing. Shortly after 3:00 PM, about 1,000 students dispersed from the high school in numerous small groups and proceeded to Brown's Chapel AME Church. At about 4:20 PM (CST), 60 to 70 Negro youths massed on the steps of Brown's Chapel, sang songs, and clapped hards to routh most freedom Brown's Chapel, sang songs, and clapped hands to rhythm of freedom songs. At about 5:00 PM (CST) they dispersed and activity ceased.

On September 26, 1963, County Court, Selma, advised that County Judge HUGH MALLORY had handled three cases involving the following individuals in County Court on that day:

On September 26, 1963, advised that a Negro youth rally took place at Brown's Chapel AME Church beginning at approximately 7:30 PM (CST) and lasting until 10:15 PM (CST). Approximately 250 to 300 Negroes, mostly teenagers, were in attendance at the rally.

Negro attorneys PETER HALL, Eirmingham, Alabama, and FRE GRAY. Mentgomery, Alabama, appeared to be the main speakers at the meeting and the general tenor of the meeting dealt with mass marches by Negroes. These marches possibly would begin on September 27, 1963.

Bureau agents surveilled the meeting and observed the above coverage at the meeting. No incidents of violence occurred.

On September 27, 1963, Bureau agents spotchecked Brown's Chapel AME Church throughout the morning and afternoon. No activities occurred until approximately 4:00 PM (CST) when five pickets were arrested while picketing the Dallas County Courthouse. No incidents occurred in connection with the arrests; they were arrested by Sheriff JAMES G. CLARK, JR. and his deputies, and taken to Dallas County Jail.

On September 27, 1963, a source of the Selma Resident Agency at Selma, reported as follows at about 10:30 AM (CST):

JAMES FORMAN, who is the titular head of the Student Nonviolent Co-ordinating Committee from New York City, is presently on the scene in Selma and is making all decisions as to the direct action demonstrations by Negroes. Also in Selma is PRATHIA HALL, Field Secretary, Student Nonviolent Co-ordinating Committee from either Philadelphia or Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. FORMAN is distrustful of all whites and would probably not furnish any information concerning any planned activity directly to a white man. He plans to have mass marches, pickets, and other type direct action demonstrations beginning September 30 through October 4, 1963. Also on the scene was LILLIAN ESTELLE GREGORY, wife of comedian DICK GREGORY of Chicago.

The source reported at approximately 4:35 PM (CST) that DICK GREGORY will probably appear in Selma this weekend or next week since his wife was arrested and a Negro rally was

scheduled for 8:00 PM this evening of September 27, 1963, at either Brown's Chapel AME Church or the First Baptist Church in Selma. The source stated that the speakers at the rally would be the Student Nonviolent Co-ordinating Committee representatives presently on the scene in Selma.

RACIAL SITUATION STATE OF ALABAMA SELMA, ALABAMA

On October 1, 1963,
Selma, Alabama, advised that no activity was taking place around the churches where the Negroes had been meeting, the First Baptist Church and Brown's Chapel AME Church, as of 12 o'clock noon CST, October 1, 1963. Bureau Agents continued to spot check these churches and other meeting places of Negroes throughout the morning of October 1, 1963, and early afternoon.

R. B. Hudson High School in Selma, advised that attendance was almost normal at the high school on October 1, 1963, with only 193 students absent.

At approximately 3 p.m. CST, Bureau Agents observed that two pickets appeared at the U. S. Post Office, 732 Alabama Avenue, Selma, carrying signs urging voter registration. They were allowed to picket until approximately 5 p.m. CST when they voluntarily rolled up their signs and left the area.

At the same time as the pickets appeared at the Post Office, three pickets appeared at the Federal Building, corner of Alabama Avenue and Lauderdale Street, carrying signs urging registration to vote. Two of the pickets on the sidewalk in front of the Federal Building on Alabama Avenue side were immediately arrested by Dallas County Sheriff's Office under the direction of JAMES G. CLARK, JR., Sheriff. One picket was arrested on the sidewalk on the Lauderdale Street side, walking toward the corner of Alabama Avenue and Lauderdale Street, and one picket who was standing near the steps of the Federal Building was allowed to stand in this position with a sign urging voter registration until 5:10 p.m. CST, when she voluntarily left the scene after rolling up her sign. Five other pickets were arrested shortly after 3 p.m. CST while picketing around the Dallas County Courthouse. All arrests were made without incident.





At approximately 7:30 p.m. CST, Bureau Agents in spot checking the scene at the First Baptist Church determined that a Negro youth rally was to take place that evening. The meeting began at 8 p.m. CST and terminated about 10 p.m. CST. Coverage of the meeting by local law enforcement officers was handled by eight members of the Dallas County Sheriff's Office, which included two posse members. One Selma Police Department car was on the scene with four officers. Deputy Sheriff WILLIAM AVERETT, Dallas County Sheriff's Office, went into the meeting in civilian clothes with the Fire Marshal. AVERETT was wearing a Fire Marshal's badge. The meeting was monitored by AVERETT and it appeared to be led by BOSSIE REESE, Negro male, nineteen years old. Approximately 250 Negro youths were in attendance, and the meeting terminated at 10 p.m. without incident.

On October 2, 1963, Dallas County b70 Court, advised as of 11 a.m. CST the court had disposed of cases involving the following individuals on the morning of October 2, 1963. These individuals were all fined \$300, 180 days in jail, their cases appealed, appeal bond set at \$1,000, and all were placed under \$1,000 peace bond prohibiting them from engaging in a breach of the peace in Alabama for a period of one year,



All of the above, according to were charged with violation of Title 14, Section 407, Alabama Code.

 As of 9:30 a.m. CST, October 2, 1963, Bureau Agents observed two pickets standing on the steps of the Federal Building, corner of Alabama Avenue and Lauderdale Street, Selma, with signs urging Negroes to register to vote and obtain first class citizenship. One picket stood on the steps on the Alabama Avenue side of the building and one on the steps on the Lauderdale Street side. They ceased picketing at approximately 11:30 a.m. CST and voluntarily left the scene. No crowds gathered, no incidents occurred, and both pickets appeared to go unnoticed during the morning.





they were on the scene to assist the racial situation in Selma, Alabama. CLARK stated that he was sent to Selma by a "member of the White House Staff" to determine details of the situation in Selma and to report on same. They also requested of Sheriff JAMES G. CLARK, JR., Dallas County, Alabama, although they were unable to contact the Sheriff personally, to inspect the Dallas County Jail and the prisoners in the road camps, namely; Camp Selma, Selma, Alabama, and Camp Camden, Camden, Alabama, where racial demonstrators are presently confined.

Stated that CLARK had sent word to them that no one was going to inspect his jail except the Federal Jail Inspector and no one would be allowed in the jail except attorneys representing clients lodged therein, visitors during regular visiting hours and FBI agents who desired to conduct interviews with prisoners.

stated that he received the impression, although they did not specifically advise him of such, that these individuals had also contacted Colonel RICHARD AULT, Commanding Officer, Craig Air Force Base, Selma, Alabama, and discussed the existing racial situation with him.

On September 29, 1963, Bureau agents learned through a check with the Selma, that reservations were being held for a Dr. JESS C. DIETZ and a Dr. W. D. PAINTER, who are also connected with the National Council of Churches.

On September 30, 1963, advised that the week end of September 28 through 29, 1963 had been quiet with the exception of four Negro females attending church sessions at the First Presbyterian Church, a white church in Selma. These women attempted to go into the white First Baptist Church, but were turned away by members of the congregation. They then walked about one-half black and were admitted to the Presbyterian Church. The women were seated in the balcony of the church and shortly after they were seated

about twenty-five members of the congregation got up and left the church. The Negro women were allegedly from Fairfield, Alabama, a suburb of Birmingham.

At about 10:00 A.M., on Sunday, September 29, 1963, about ten Negroes attempted to enter the white Catholic church, Church of The Assumption, Washington Street, Selma, however they were also turned away by the members of the congregation and they did not enter this church. No incidents of violence accompanied these actions on Sunday.



Stated that no direct action demonstrations were to occur at Selma on September 30, as legal advise and discussion was taking place relative to the fact that Negro leaders who had been arrested who are connected with SNCC and whose cases have been heard in Dallas County Court have been placed under a \$1,000.00 "peace bond", which bond means that in the event they are arrested for a breach of the peace within a period of one year in the State of Alabama the bond will be forfaited.

The meeting began with a songfest at 7:45 P.M. (CST) which continued until 8:20 P.M.

Reverend L. L. ANDERSON, then spoke to the crowd and urged people to register to vote. He stated the Negro wanted recreation facilities, decent homes and first class citizenship. He stated he did not intend to preach hate but Negroes intended to be free and register to vote. He told the crowd not to hate their "white brothers" but the "love them". "The Negro must not turn back from their purpose but go forward".

Mrs. MARIE FOSTER, Negro female, spoke on the fact that white children are being taught by elders to hate and refer to the Negro as "niggers". She stated that they do not know what they are saying, but have been taught this by their parents. This is the time for Selma Negroes to awake and strive for freedom.

Mrs. AMELIA P. BOYNTON spoke on the fact that LILLIAN GREGORY, wife of comedian DICK GREGORY, was

presently being held in Dallas County Jail. She stated that the reason she was in jail was that she wanted to be free and that she has been deprived of her rights, also. She stated that money is coming into Selma and that the Negro "can get it". She also stated that children who were arrested in the demonstrations in Selma had been "beaten in jail and adult Negroes should now enter into the activity for freedom".

During the evering of September 30, 1963, at about 8:30 P.M.(CST) telephonically contacted a Bureau agent and stated he objected to law enforcement officers outside of the church recording license tags in the area amound the clurch. At about 9:00 P.M. (CST) he again contacted Bureau agent telephonically and stated that he objected to local law enforcement officers being inside of the church taking tape recordings of the meeting and that wenforcement officers to leave the meeting. He pointed out that both of the above incidents are "nothing more than acts of intimidation by local law enforcement officers".

Bureau agents observed the voter registration rally on the night of September 30, 1963, and the local law enforcement offices also covered this meeting. The crowd was estimated at 4,000 to 5,000, with about 70 per cent teenagers. There were about fifteen Sheriff's deputies and posse members on the scene and six Selma Police Department officers. One Alabama Department of Public Safety investigator was also on the scene and stationed inside of the meeting until 9:10 P.M.(CST) when asked to leave by The meeting terminated at approximately 10:30 P.M.(CST) and the Negroes dispersed from the church.

RACIAL MATTERS - MI BILE On the evening of 10/3/63, Assistant Attorney General (AAG) Marshall expressed to Mr. Evans some concern about the racial situation at Selma, Alabama, where Negroes have for the past several days been picketing two Federal buildings, the Federal Building and the Post Office. Mr. Marshall is concerned that since this is Government property the local authorities might refuse to take any action if violence breaks out between Negroes and whites. The pickets have been urging Negro voter registration. It was pointed out to AAG Marshall that Negroes had picketed the Federal Building at Selma on 10/3/63, where U. S. District Judge Daniel H. Thomas, Southern District of Alabama, was holding court. The U.S. Marshal (USM) instructed two Negro pickets to leave the scene which they did immediately. Mr. Marshall indicated that this might be true while court is in session but that after court is over the Negroes might return there and the problem would again be presented. SAC Dalness at Mobile was contacted for an up-to-date picture of the situation at Selma and he advised that there would be no problem at Selma since Chief of Police E. W. Mullen, a National Academy graduate, and Sheriff James G. Clark, Jr., of Dallas County in which Selma is situated would preserve order. The picketing activity at the Federal Building and ž Post Office has been limited to two pickets at each building. 3 No white activity has been generated by the presence of the pickets and they have been practically unnoticed. 

On October 2, 1963, Bureau Agents observed two pickets at the Federal Building, corner of Lauderdale Street and Alabama Avenue, one standing on steps at entrance to building on Alabama Avenue and one standing on steps of Lauderdale Street side, with signs urging registration to vote. The two pickets appeared at about 9:00 a.m. Central Standard Time (CST) and left the building voluntarily about 11:30 a.m. At about 2:00 p.m. CST two different pickets returned to the building and picketed by standing on the steps at the two entrances until about 4:00 p.m. CST. No arrests were made; pickets went unnoticed, and they voluntarily terminated picketing activities and left the scene.

With further reference to my memorandum this morning, SAC Dalness has advised that all is quiet in Selma as of 10:15 A. M., Central Standard Time (CST), (12:15 Washington, D. C., time). No pickets have appeared at any of the Federal buildings and a rally is scheduled tonight for the Negroes at 7:30 P. M. at the First Baptist Church. Negro comedian Dick Gregory is scheduled to arrive in Selma at 2 P. M. CST, today, reportedly for a speaking engagment.

SAC Dalness indicated that the Selma Police Department consists of the Chief of Police, E. W. Mullins (NA), and a complement of 26 officers.

SAC Dalness indicated that Departmental Attorney Thelton Henderson, (a Negro), is on the scene in Selma and is working closely with the Negro community. Mr. Henderson has assurred the Mobile Office that he will stay in close touch with the office and the Negro community and will advise the office of any problems that may arise.

The U. S. Attorney at Mobile has advised SAC Dalness that he has looked up some law on the subject of jurisdiction over Federal buildings, and that in the case of buildings constructed prior to 1940, the Federal Government has primary jurisdiction; however, will always accede to state control. Those buildings constructed subsequent to 1940 are under state jurisdiction. Of the two buildings involved in Selma, the Federal building was constructed prior to 1940 and the Post Office Building subsequent to 1940.
