CIVIL RIGHTS MEETING TO FINANCE SELMA, ALABAMA, DELEGATION, MARCH 15, 1965, CHICAGO, ILLINOIS RACIAL MATTERS

Chicago, Illinois, advised the Chicago Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, at 8:27 p.m. on March 15, 1965, that on that date, a civil rights meeting had commenced at approximately 8 p.m. at the Christ Methodist Church, 6401 South Sangamon Street, Chicago, Illinois. The meeting was held under the leadership of Reverend John Porter, pastor of that church, who has recently returned to Chicago from Selma, Alabama.

67C

stated that the meeting had been called to finance a ten-member delegation to depart from Chicago, Illinois, for Selma, Alabama, within the next few days. One Reverend E. Cameron, a representative of the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party of Hattiesburg, Mississippi, was scheduled as a speaker at this affair.

The "Chicago Sun-Times" issue of March 16, 1965, contained an article captioned "Minister Calls for Boycott Of Alabama, Miss. Goods." The article states in part as follows:

44-21544-65 ENCLOSURE , , Re: CIVIL RIGHTS MEETING TO FINANCE SELMA, ALABAMA, DELEGATION, MARCH 15, 1965, CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

"A leader of the Mississippi Freedom Party called Monday night for a Chicago boycott of goods manufactured in Alabama and Mississippi.

"Speaking before a civil rights rally at the Christ Methodist Church, 6401 S. Sangamon, the Rev. John E. Cameron said, 'It won't hurt the Negroes any because we don't have good jobs down there to lose anyway.'

"'If you can commit yourself and let your wisdom become a contagious force in Chicago, it will not be necessary for children to starve in Mississippi and Alabama,' he said.

"The Rev. Mr. Cameron, a Hattiesburg (Miss.) minister, praised President Johnson's congressional message. 'He finally caught the spirit of the freedom movement. He used the symbol of justice when I heard him say, "We shall overcome."

"The church rally was held to obtain funds to send a 10-man delegation to Selma, Ala., Wednesday...."

Details concerning this matter were furnished on March 15, 1965, to Region I, 113th INTC Group, Chicago, Illinois.







1965 to see a girl acquaintance off on the bus for Montgomery, Alabama, STICKGOLD said his acquaintance's name was who is listed as a Freshman at the University of Wisconsin. Mr. STICKGOLD further stated he attended the meeting at which instructions were given to members of the group concerning their behavior and techniques to be used in avoiding trouble during the Civil Rights demonstrations that they expected to participate in upon arrival in Alabama. While at this meeting, Mr. STICKGOLD identified himself, advised the group of his official position, gave them his name, address and phone number and told them to call him if they needed help. Mr. STICKGOLD then returned to his office in Madison and called the U.S. Department of Justice, Washington, D.C. and advised that department of his action. Mr. STICKGOLD stated the representative of the department to whom he spoke thanked him for calling and said the department wanted to have information on out of state groups connected with Civil Rights demonstrations in the South so that the department could offer protection. (u)

On March 17, 1965 North Central Airlines, Madison, Wisconsin, advised that the plane chartered by Freedom Flyers group connected with the University of Wisconsin left Madison airport at 1:58 A.M., on March 17, 1965 destined for Montgomery, Alabama. (4)

However, the plane was grounded at Chicago. Illinois because of the weather and to the best of knowledge, is currently stranded in Chicago. said the future plans for the plane were uncertain but he had heard the group might decide to go to Washington, D.C. instead of Alabama. (4)

A source has advised that on October 26-27, 1963, a conference of members of the Communist Party (CP), including National Functionaries, met in Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of setting in motion forces for the establishment of a new national Marxist-oriented youth organization which would hunt for the most peaceful transition to socialism. The delegates to this meeting were cautioned against the germ of anti-Soviet and anti-CP ideologies. These delegates were also told that it would be reasonable to assume that the young socialists attracted into this new organization would eventually pass into the CP itself.

A second conference of over 20 persons met in Chicago on December 28-29, 1963, for the purpose of initiating a "call" to the new youth organization and planning for a founding convention to be held in June, 1964.

A second source has advised that the founding convention for the new youth organization was held from June 19-21, 1964, at 150 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, California, at which time the name W. E. B. Du Bois Clubs of America was adopted. Approximately 500 delegates from throughout the United States attended this convention. The aims of this organization, as set forth in the preamble to the constitution, are, "It is our belief that this nation can best solve its problems in an atmosphere of peaceful co-existence, complete disarmament and true freedom for all peoples of the world, and that these solutions will be reached mainly through the united efforts of all democratic elements in our country, composed essentially of the working people allied in the unity of Negroes and other minorities with whites. We further fully recognize that the greatest threat to American democracy comes from the racist and right wing forces in coalition with the most reactionary sections of the economic power structure, using the tool of anti-communism to divide and destroy the unified struggle of the working people. As young people in the forces struggling for democracy, we shall actively strive to defeat these reactionary and neo-fascist elements and to achieve complete freedom and democracy for all Americans, thus enabling each individual to freely choose and build the society he would wish to live in. Through these struggles we feel the American people will realize the viability of the socialist alternatives."




The constitution further states that this new organization shall be a membership organization open to individuals or if five or more people so desire a chapter can be formed which shall in turn be guided by the policies and principles of the parent organization.

The second source has also advised that at the founding convention it was voted that the organization should be temporarily headquartered in San Francisco, California, although no specific physical location was decided upon. This same source advised on June 29, 1964 that the temporary headquarters of this organization is 1007 McAllister Street, San Francisco, which is the headquarters of the W. E. B. DuBois Club of San Francisco.

Both sources have advised that at the founding convention, two officers were elected:

PHILIP CHAPIN DAVIS, President, and CARL ELLENGER BLOICE, Publications Chairman.

TEXT OF GOVERNOR GEORGE C. WALLACE'S SPEECH BEFORE THE JOINT SESSION OF THE ALABAMA LEGISLATURE ON MARCH 18, 1965

We see a most unprecedented order - unprecedented in the annals of American history having been rendered by a Federal court here in Montgomery, Alabama.

We stopped the so called march from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama, because we understood ourselves that at that time what a colosal undertaking it would be to provide safety and security, not only to the marchers but to vehicular traffic of the other citizens of the State and Nation who customarily used that highway.

To show you that we understood when others did not, and evidently the Federal courts did not, I have a telegram in my hand from one of the leaders of the march that says we expect you to meet help and safety needs of 5,000 marchers.

This telegram addressed to me, the Governor of Alabama. To meet help and safety needs of 5,000 marchers Sunday 21 of March, over 12 miles of U. S. Highway 380, of 300 marchers Monday 22, Tuesday 23, Wednesday 24, and Thursday March 25 on the same highway to Montgomery; of 5,000 - 10,000 demonstrators who need some facilities within Montgomery, Thursday 25 on the final four miles to the State Capital.

State responsibility can be met adequately by providing the following minimum needs: six equipped ambulances; two mobile aid stations; nine 300-gallom water trailers; portable toilet facilities; two rubbish disposal trucks and containers; mobile radio communications for coordination; adequate medical personnel - position, murses and aid men; State control, protection and coordination of all above medical and public health activities. Great and dedicated men of the past worked diligently and honestly to establish the integrity and justice of our court system.

From their work has come a faith by the people in the courts and a dignity and respect accorded the courts that has been the rock upon which our house of freedom has rested - by the work that integrity and faith has been shaken in the last number of years.

Now they say our courts are too slow. We must therefore submit to the speedier expediencies of wob rule. That a Federal judge concurs and prostitutes our law in favor of that mob rule while it would critical wearing the robes and clothing in the respect built by great and honest men is a tragedy beyond any words.

Here are a few examples of what Judge Johnson emphasizes as "peaceful demonstrations": these demonstrators, wielding knives, slashed the clothing of law enforcement officers. They have thrown bricks and bottles at law enforcement officers and at passing automobiles, including a car driven by a member of the Alabama Legislature.

They have smashed windows, have invaded court rooms in Perry and Dallas Counties. They have laid down in the streets, refusing to let even ambulances pass through. They have invaded the front yards and front porches of private homes and refused to move.

They have been granted the right to deny the use of public streets and sidewalks to other citizens to the exclusive use of the demonstrators.

They are mobs employing the street warfare tactics of the Communists and it is upon these people and upon their energy that a Federal judge, proceeding of a mock court, places a stamp of approval as their "rights."

And now that Federal judge compounds the anarchy by ordering the State of Alabama to protect this street army on its march from Selma.

Perhaps it would be well to see what plans were necessary for a one day demonstration in Washington. Official sources tell us what the Federal Government did to keep the march in Washington peaceful.

Under military planning directed by Lieutenant Colonel John Downey, 4,000 combat troops including one Marine battalion were stationed in Washington and maintained on an alert status.

In addition to these troops, the Army provided an additional 2,500 combat battalion troops which were held available at Army posts on the outskirts of Washington.

Twenty-six teams of two to four men a team were assigned to selected areas of Washington for the purpose of observing and reporting any disorder. All leave for members of the police department were canceled for the week of August 25 in order that the force would be at its full strength of 2.500 men.

full strength of 2,500 men.

In addition 500 civilian reserves were on duty in outlying precincts to preserve the peace around the perimeter of the District.

In fact, without going into any more details it took nearly 300,000 people to provide a peaceful march of one day in Washington and it cost \$8,005 for the one day in Washington.

We have reliable information that over 200 nationally known entertainers are coming into this State for this demonstration. The call has come out from the demonstration leaders for every left-wing, pro-Communist, Fellow Travelers and Communist in the country to be here. And we know that we can expect them along with the usual number of dupes and poor misguided individuals. Any responsible person can see that this well planned, well financed assault is going to be much more difficult to control than was the one day march on Washington. May I remind you again that we have practically all of the same groups behind the Alabama demonstrations who planned and instigated the Washington march.

If this financial burden were imposed upon the State, the money would be taken from moneys which otherwise would be used for the care of our sick and infirm, both white and Negro - which would provide for the care of tuberculosis patients, both white and Negro - which provided for our program for aid to dependent children, the majority of whom are Negroes, and any other people of our State whose care and comfort and health depend on such funds.

It would cost an estimated \$350,000 to \$400,000 of State funds to handle this march completely by ourselves in this city.

We have 600 state troopers today who have been taken away from protecting the other people of our State in order to protect demonstrators and to police the areas in which they happen to be located.

I am sure that if the facts were known there are a number of Alabamians who have met their deaths on the highway because of the lack of protection in the last number of weeks - either from drunken drivers or careless drivers who would have been taken off the highways had the law enforcement officials been carrying on their normal duties.

We see today a philosophy that says to the people,
"You need not bother to work and meet multiplication of a
free man. All you must do is demonstrate and cause chaos
and create a situation whereby our propagandists, mascaraeding
as newsmen, may destroy faith in local law enforcement and
may impune the decency of local law enforcement so that we
may take all police powers into the central Government."

may take all police powers into the central Government."

That is the anomalous price that the demonstrators pay-many of them Communist trade to bring about such a development.

Such a development is taking place. And sadly, the Negroes used as tools in this tragic type of Communist street warfare have no conception of the misery and slavery they are bringing to their children.

Before the Civil Rights Act was passed by Congress, Mr. Robert Kennedy said, "If we can just pass this act, it will take the issues out of the streets and put them in the courts." I said then it would do no such thing for the issue is but a single, clearly—defined issue — preservation of the districts of the U. S. of America.

There shall be no end to the street chaos only temporary respite while the collectivist press builds up another phony issue by which the trained demonstrators may again take to the streets in riotous disorder.

I say to you tonight that the street warfard and demonstrations that once plagued Czechoslovakia, that ripped Cuba apart, that destroyed Diem in Viet Nam, that raped China that has torn civilization and established institutions of this world to bloody shreds, now courses through the streets of America, rips asunder the town of Selma and laughs at the doorstep of every American, black and white.

I am the Governor of this State elected by you

I am the Governor of this State elected by you the people. I have fought for you and I have spoken across this land for you. I have kept faith with you.

Tonight I would like to offer words that are something more than words of alarm. Not that I have anything against public alarm - for were it not for the alarm sounded by Patrick Henry we might not tonight be products of a free people.

Tonight, I should like to ask you - the people of Alabama - for restraint. I am asking you to stay away from the points of tension if at all possible.

The first of the second of the second I do not ask you for cowardice but I ask you for restraint in the same tradition that our outnumbered forefathers followed. I ask you not to play into the hands of the enemies of our Nation and our freedom.

I ask you to hold firm and I ask you to exercise that superior discipline that is yours. Lask you to do, if you will, the same as you did when I stood at Tuscaloosa, Alabama. Please stay home. Let's have peace.

Outside the door of my office there stands a monument and on it these words are written:

> "Fames temple boasts no higher name. No King is grander on his throne; No glory shines with brighter gleam; , The name of "Patriot" stands alone"

I ask you tonight for patriotism in its finest hour and its highest duty and I ask you to restrain yourselves and I ask you at the time this march takes place if you will stay at your work bench, that you will stay at your home, and that you will let this matter be handled by those in

Our security forces have today told us after thorough studies what it will take to police this march. For maximum security on a 50-mile walk, when it was only 10 miles to be secured in Washington, it will take 2,057 personnel on a 24-hour shift, 163 cars and 15 busses. Top.

It will take 4,114 men on a 12-hour shift and a light increase in the number of vehicles and on an eight-hour shift it will take 6,171 law enforcement personnel for maximum security.

For limited security on a 24-hour shift it will take 772 personnel - on a 12-hour shift, 1,544 and on an eight-hour shift, 2314.

The other day the leader of the demonstration said in an open Federal court that "I will not obey an unjust order" - he said "The order issued to me by the Federal court was unjust and I do not have to obey an unjust order."

I say this order is unjust - I say that many orders of Federal courts that have been issued are unjust. But whether they are unjust or not, if anarchy is not to prevail. We must obey even though it be galling.

Even though it provokes our heritage, we still must obey an order of a court when it becomes a final order.

So we will obey - we will do our duty. We will not advocate our responsibilities to provide protection in as best we can because that is the duty of your Governor and the State. I said on national television that we would obey court orders even though those who lead demonstrations say that they will decide whether the order is just or unjust. In view of the circumstances outlined and with awareness of the serious nature of this insensible burden placed on the State of Alabama, I intend to call on the President of the United States to provide sufficient Federal civil authorities or officers to provide for the safety and welfare of citizens in and along the route of the proposed march and to provide for the safety and welfare of the so called demonstrators. I hope the Legislature of this State will approve.

The Federal courts have created this matter. They can help us out of the same. Let's you and I - the people of Alabama - see that this march is peaceful.

Let's show the people of this Nation our superior discipline in times of distress and then when this march has been concluded peacefully I shall ask, along with you, that those in authority who had influence upon these to ask for a sufficient of these continuous demonstrations and with the courts of this land decide the issues involved.

And I say to you in conclusion tonight that my prayers are that God will bless all the people of this great and sovereign State, both white and black, and say that our administration will continue to try to provide a better life for all the citizens of this State, regardless of their race, color, creed, religion or national origin.

I sincerely hope that the Legislature of this State and the people of Alabama will stand with me in this crisis that we face here in Alabama.

who said that he had been drinking told Mrs. Newman that he was opposed to the march from Selma to Montgomery. He has a small plane, and unless the march is called off some things can be accomplished from the air that could not be accomplished from the ground.

At about 1:30 P.M. Richard Lynch, Attorney, Civil Rights Division, received a similar call from who also told Lynch that he had been drinking. Told Lynch that he was going "to get that damn Nigger, Martin Luther King, who was causing all this trouble" and that he will stop the march even if he has to hire a plane to fly down there. He also said that some people are going to get hurt. also told Lynch that Governor Wallace is an instigator and that he ought to be taken care of.




