These ME 262's were seen for five minutes continuing parallel in Northward direction, then lost from sight. A few minutes later at 1155 hours a second group of ME 262's were seen flying in a loose "V" formation in the same relative posttion as the first five, at an altitude of 30,000 feet at 4840N - 1235E.
