ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGERS OF THE
NATIONAL HOME FOR DISABLED VOLUNTEER SOLDIERS
FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1886.

To the honorable the Senate and House of Representatives of the
United States in Congress assembled :

The Board of Managers of the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers makes the following report of the institution for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1886, in obedience to the law :

During the year three vacancies occurred in the Board, viz: One on October 29, 1885, by the death of General George B. McClellan, who was always an able, earnest, and energetic member of the Board. The vacancy thus made was not filled until after the expiration of what would have been General McClellan's term of office. The other two vacancies were caused by the expiration of the terms of service of General M. T. McMahon and Maj. David C. Fulton on April 22, 1886. These vacancies were filled by joint resolution of Congress; that of General McClellan by the appointment of William J. Sewell, of New Jersey, and those made by the expirations of terms of service by M. T. McMahon, of New York, to succeed himself, and by John L. Mitchell, of Wisconsin, to succeed David C. Fulton, of Wisconsin.

The usual duties of the Board have been performed during the year as defined by the organic law, quarterly meetings have been held, the branches of the Home have been visited and inspected, their wants have been supplied by the funds appropriated by Congress for their support, and the statements and complaints of the members have been patiently heard, and correction applied wherever it has been found necessary.

The accounts of the general treasurer of the Home, and those of the treasurers of the branches have been examined and audited.

The materials for bedding and clothing have been furnished by contract after due public advertisement, and have been made up at the Home in all cases possible by the work of the members.

The contract system has been extended to the purchase of all articles of regular consumption and use by the Home except in cases in which such contracts are impossible or not for the interest of the Home. The result has been increased economy in the conduct of the Home, as is shown by the annual cost per capita, and an improvement in the articles furnished.

The Board is of the opinion that the members of the Home have been well and comfortably fed, clothed, and housed, and it has had no complaints from the members on these subjects.

Congress at its last session appropriated \$150,000 for new barracks at the Northwestern, Southern, and Western Branches. The money did not become available until after the adjournment of Congress in August, too late to permit the completion of the barracks before the winter. The erection of proper structures has, however, been commenced at the branches named, and it is expected that nearly all of them will be ready for occupation within a month. In the mean time men are cared for on the barrack floors and in the corridors, giving them the best shelter possible under the circumstances. The appropriation above referred to will give additional accommodation for 800 or 1,000 men, and nearly, if not quite, the whole of this room will be utilized as soon as it is ready.

There should be more accommodation furnished, but the Board is not prepared to recommend the enlargement of any of the existing branches,

unless it be the Western, which, being the latest built, was laid out with reference to very large expansion.

The attention of Congress is respectfully asked to the report of the Board for the last year for its views on this subject.

The average number present of members of the Home for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1886, was 8,946, against 8,050 for the preceding year, showing an increase of 11.13 per cent.

The increase for the fiscal year 1882-'83 was 7.22 per cent., for 1883-'84, 7.99 per cent., for 1884-'85, 11.9 per cent., and for 1885-'86, 11.13 per cent. If there be accommodation at the branches, and Congress appropriate the necessary funds, it is the opinion of the Board that the same or a greater percentage of increase would continue for a time, which the Board has no data for determining.

For the last fiscal year the increase was between 11 and 12 per cent., and during the past six months it was nearly 18 per cent. This ratio of increase is likely to continue for a decade to come. The survivors of the war are growing old, their disabilities are severer, and the number who are unable to support themselves is for these reasons rapidly increasing. Notwithstanding the fact that a new Home, capable of providing for 1,500 additional members, has recently been completed at Leavenworth, Kans., there are yet many disabled and destitute soldiers cared for in the almshouses of the country. Several of the States have endeavored to provide for this emergency by the erection of State Homes. Illinois, Ohio, Iowa, Michigan, and Pennsylvania have recently established State Homes, and such homes have for some time been established in New York, California, Massachusetts, Vermont, New Jersey, Connecticut, and in a few other States. If Congress should provide by law for assisting in maintaining the soldiers admitted to these State Homes by authorizing the Board of Managers to pay one-half of the cost of supporting each soldier thus provided for, the necessity of building additional Homes might be avoided except in the case of that recommended for the Pacific slope.

It is apparent to the Board of Managers that the Home is gradually becoming a great hospital. The necessity for increased hospital accommodations is more urgent every year as the age and disabilities of the members increase. In all of the branches the hospitals are overcrowded, and men who ought to be in hospital have to be cared for in barracks not built nor arranged for sick men. There is much suffering caused by the inadequate hospital accommodation which ought to be alleviated if possible. The increase in the ages of the men, the fact that their diseases become chronic as they grow older, that their diet must be different from those who can live in barracks, that in time they become bed-ridden, all these require that the hospital shall soon become the ruling feature of the Home.

At the Southern Branch, at Hampton, a hospital which will care for 240 patients has just been finished. It is already filled.

At the Northwestern Branch, at Milwaukee, the hospital, although inadequate for the requirements, is susceptible of enlargement without great cost.

At the Central Branch, at Dayton, Ohio, the hospital contains 450 beds and is full. More than that number who are fit subjects for a hospital are in barracks. The hospital ought to be at once enlarged, and it is respectfully recommended that the sum of \$60,000 be appropriated for such enlargement.

At the Eastern Branch, at Augusta, the hospital was erected when the branch was intended to accommodate 800 members. Like the others, it is filled to overflowing. Its capacity should be doubled, and it is re-

spectfully recommended that \$60,000 be appropriated to increase it. The sum asked for will make it available for 160 men.

At the Western Branch, at Leavenworth, there is no hospital. A barrack capable of holding 80 patients is in use for a hospital. It is needed for occupation by the more hardy members of the branch, and a hospital should be built at once. The hospital at the Southern Branch is a model building. Its drawings and specifications are available for use at the Western Branch. Its cost was \$124,000, and it is respectfully recommended that that sum be appropriated for the erection of the hospital at the Western Branch, at Leavenworth, Kans.

In the report of the Board for the last two fiscal years the establishment of a branch of the Home west of the Rocky Mountains was recommended. The necessity for such a branch becomes more apparent every day, and the recommendation is respectfully reiterated.

There are many survivors of the Mexican war resident in California, who are now needy and require the shelter of a home. There are more than six thousand veterans of the last war resident on the Pacific Coast. Many of these are in a destitute condition and require the care of the Government as much as those residing east of the mountains. Every dictate of humanity calls for the establishment of a branch of the home that will be easily accessible to these men, and the object can only be attained by the establishment of a branch as recommended above.

The tables appended to this report, from A to F, inclusive, show the financial transactions of the Board for the fiscal year and the estimates for the next fiscal year.

Table G shows the expenses in detail of the Board of Managers for the last fiscal year. Table H shows the average number present, and present and absent, during the two last fiscal years. Table I shows the number of members present on June 30 last, and the number present on the 10th, 20th, and last day of each month since that date. Table J shows the total number of members present, and present and absent, at the end of each fiscal year from the organization of the Home, in 1867, to June 30, 1886, the total number of deaths, and the annual percentage of deaths. Table K gives the annual cost of keeping each member of the Home from its organization to June 30, 1886; all expenses are included except those for construction and purchases of land. Tables L and L' give the accounts-current of the acting treasurer for the last fiscal year; Table L for the general fund and Table L' for the appropriation for the Western Branch.

Table M shows the number of pensioners, the amount paid to families of pensioners through the treasurers of the branches, and the amount paid direct to pensioners.

The record of members showing the changes from July 1, 1885, to June 30, 1886, is appended to this report.

The report of the secretary gives the journal of the proceedings of the Board of Managers for the fiscal year, the statistics of the Home for the same period, and the annual report of each Home.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF MANAGERS OF THE NATIONAL HOME FOR DISABLED VOLUNTEER SOLDIERS, JULY 8, 1885.

NEW YORK, *July 8, 1885.*

The Board met in regular quarterly meeting at the New York Hotel, in the city of New York, on the 8th day of July, 1885, at 11 a. m.

Present: General W. B. Franklin, president of the Board; Col. L. A. Harris, General M. T. McMahon, General George B. McClellan, General James S. Negley, General Thomas W. Hyde, General John C. Black.

Absent: The President of the United States, the Chief Justice of the United States, the Secretary of War, General John A. Martin, Maj. D. C. Fulton.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were approved.

The Board gave a hearing to Mr. P. H. McGrew, director of the Soldiers' Home in Napa Valley, California, who stated on behalf of the directors of that institution that they desired to present the Home to the Board of Managers of the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers, unencumbered, and that certain gentlemen connected with the management of the Napa Valley Home would pay the expenses of the Board of Managers or of a committee of the Board who might be appointed to examine the site. The action of the Board heretofore taken in connection with the establishment of a branch on the Pacific coast was explained to Mr. McGrew, and he was informed that the Board, under the circumstances, was not at liberty to take action in the premises without further instructions from Congress, and suggested that the Board of Directors of the California Home should communicate with their representatives in Congress and recommend such legislation as they deem advisable to carry out the recommendation of the Board heretofore made and the views of the authorities of the Napa Home.

The president presented estimates for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1887, accompanied by a table of post returns for the years 1884 and 1885. After careful consideration the estimates were agreed upon as follows:

Whereupon the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the Board of Managers of the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers estimate and appropriate, out of the moneys which may be provided by law, the sum of \$460,159.92, as necessary to meet the current expenses of the five

branches of the Home for the quarter ending September 30, 1885, and for construction and repairs, out-door relief, and incidental expenses of the National Home; and that the acting treasurer be, and he is hereby, authorized and empowered to take such means as may be necessary to obtain the sum of \$460,159.92 from the Treasury of the United States, and to receipt therefor in the name and behalf of the National Home.

Colonel Harris offered the following resolution, which, after full discussion, was adopted:

Resolved, That the president of the Board be authorized and directed to appoint an additional officer at the Central Branch, to define his duties and fix his compensation, subject to the approval of the Board.

Colonel Harris offered the following resolution, which was adopted:

Resolved, That the amount of \$5,000, heretofore appropriated for a breakwater at the Southern Branch, be expended under the direction of the president of the Board and local manager.

The question of the necessity of improvements of a permanent character at the Southern branch was brought up, upon report of the engineer appointed to visit the branch, and, after full discussion the following resolution, was adopted, providing for needs regarded as particularly pressing:

Resolved, That the sum of \$15,000 be appropriated for the improvement of the steam, gas, and water supplies at that branch, and the sum of \$3,000 for the dredging of John's Creek. The said sums of money to be expended under direction of the president of the Board and the local manager.

Colonel Harris presented a petition of members of the Central Branch, requesting that the Rev. H. Gellert be engaged as a clergyman, for the benefit of the German-speaking members of the Home.

After full consideration, it was resolved, that authority be given to engage the services of the Rev. H. Gellert for the purpose indicated, and that he be paid \$50 per month while so employed, commencing from July 1, 1885.

Colonel Harris presented the following report from the committee appointed to audit the accounts of the treasurer of the Southern Branch:

HAMPTON, VA., July 3, 1885.

I have this day examined the accounts of Capt. William Thompson, treasurer Southern Branch, National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers, for the period commencing April 1, 1884, and ending March 31, 1885, and find them correct, and supported by proper vouchers. Referring to missing vouchers belonging to the accounts of Capt. P. T. Woodlin, treasurer, referred to in preceding certificate, I am informed that although repeated demands have been made upon the auditor, the voucher has not been returned.

I find that the treasurer has received during this period, including balance of cash on hand April 1, 1884, \$194,270.99 in cash, and has expended \$190,819.46, leaving a balance on hand March 3, 1885, of \$3,451.53.

HAMPTON, VA., July 3, 1885.

I have this day examined the accounts of the store fund at the Southern Branch, National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers, for the period commencing April 1, 1884, and ending March 31, 1885, and find them correct and supported by proper vouchers. I learn that the bank in which this store fund was deposited, the Exchange National Bank of Norfolk, Va., a designated United States depository, closed its doors on April 2, last. This fund had at that time \$7,713.83 to its credit. I also learn that the honorable Solicitor of the Treasury has decided that this deposit cannot be considered a Government deposit, and consequently, as the per cent. of payment is not yet known, the actual cash balance cannot be shown.

On motion, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the president of the Board is hereby authorized to expend the sum of \$5,000 in the erection of a wooden barrack at the Eastern Branch, the design for which is to be approved by the president and local manager, and to make such changes and additions to the heating apparatus as may be necessary to heat the hospital independent of the barracks.

The president reported that contracts had been entered into for the construction of eight barracks at the Western Branch, two of them to be used temporarily as hospital and headquarters building. Also, that a contract had been made with the Leavenworth Water Works for an adequate supply of water for all purposes, and for the purchase of the necessary water mains for the grounds. Also, that a contract had been made with the authorities of the city of Leavenworth, in accordance with authority heretofore given by the Board (printed minutes, page 36, vol. 2), for the payment in yearly installments of \$5,000 each of the \$50,000 donated by the city for the embellishment of the Home grounds, and for the deposit in his hands of that amount of bonds of the city of Leavenworth, and the surrender of such bonds as the installments are paid.

Whereupon, on motion, the action of the president, as reported, was approved and confirmed by the Board.

The Board thereupon took a recess, and proceeded to the Eastern Branch, Togus, Me., reconvening on the morning of the 10th instant.

After inspection and review of the members of the Home and the barracks, hospitals, grounds, and quarters, the Board proceeded to the investigation of certain charges preferred against Dr. Bolan, surgeon of the Eastern Branch. All the witnesses whose names had been furnished the Board, for the purpose of substantiating the charges, had been duly notified to appear. Two witnesses presented themselves and were examined by the Board, in the presence of Dr. Bolan. Other witnesses were present for the purpose of testifying in behalf of Dr. Bolan, but it was not deemed necessary to take their testimony.

Upon motion of General Black, the charges against Dr. Bolan were dismissed, by unanimous vote of the Board.

Colonel Harris presented the following report of the auditing committee on the accounts of the acting treasurer for the quarter ending June 30, 1885, which was received and ordered to be placed on the minutes:

TOGUS, ME., July 9, 1885.

The undersigned have this day examined and audited the accounts of General W. B. Franklin, acting treasurer of the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers, for the quarter ending 30th June, 1885, and find the same correct, and supported by proper vouchers.

The balance in his hands on the 30th day of June, 1885, was \$59,676.07 belonging to the general fund, and \$223,018.85 belonging to the Western Branch fund. Total, \$282,694.92.

Upon motion, it was resolved that, when the Board adjourn, it be to meet at the Central Branch, near Dayton, Ohio, on Wednesday, September 23, 1885, at 11 a. m.

Martin.

After examination of the buildings in course of construction and the grounds, the Board proceeded to the Northwestern Branch, at Milwaukee, Wis., where inspection was made of the quarters, barracks, grounds, &c., and the complaints of such members as desired to present themselves in person were received and acted upon.

The Board thereupon proceeded to New York, where they were joined by General George B. McClellan and General James S. Negley, which completed a quorum.

Whereupon the following resolution was adopted :

Resolved, That the Board of Managers of the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers estimate and appropriate out of the moneys which may be provided by law the sum of \$381,459.29 as necessary to meet the current expense of the five branches of the Home for the quarter ending 31st December, 1885, and for construction and repairs, out-door relief, and incidental expenses of the National Home; and that the acting treasurer be, and he is hereby, authorized and empowered to take such means as may be necessary to obtain the sum of \$381,459.29 from the Treasury of the United States, and to receipt therefor in the name and behalf of the National Home.

General Martin offered the following resolution:

Resolved, That the inspector-general and the governor of the Western Branch be instructed to have four of the barrack buildings made ready for the reception of members at the earliest possible moment; that the buildings thus referred to should not for the present be plastered; that a temporary dining-hall be arranged either in the basement or the first story of one of these buildings; and that a temporary kitchen be constructed.

The purpose of this resolution is to provide quarters for three or four hundred members in the Western Home by the 1st of December next, and to the accomplishment of this object the inspector-general and the governor of the Home are directed to devote their immediate attention.

Colonel Harris offered a resolution; which, after discussion and modification, was unanimously adopted, as follows:

In view of the fact that the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers is now full, with 2,249 men on furlough and that overcrowding will impair the health of the members now present: Therefore, be it

Resolved, That the maximum capacity of each branch be fixed as follows: The Central Branch, 4,400; Northwestern Branch, 1,375; Eastern Branch, 1,350; Southern Branch, 1,600; but it is not intended that this resolution shall affect the privilege of return to the Home of such of its members as are absent on leave and who shall return within the time specified in their furloughs.

Colonel Harris offered the following resolution :

Resolved, That the rule as to readmissions (printed minutes, pages 640 and 655, vol. 1) be so amended that hereafter only applications of dishonorably discharged members shall be considered by the Board, and that the president and secretary be authorized to prepare a blank application for readmission.

On motion of Colonel Harris, the president of the Board was authorized to execute a contract with Saint Mary's Academy permitting that institution to lay a water-pipe in the home grounds of the Western Branch to connect with the mains of the Leavenworth City and Fort Leavenworth Water Company.

The president presented a letter addressed by him to the Leavenworth Gas Company, as follows :

HARTFORD, CONN., July 13, 1885.

Mr. DAVID HENNING,

President Leavenworth Gas Company :

DEAR SIR : I will recommend the Board of Managers, N. H. D. V. S., to approve a contract between it and your company on the following terms, viz : You are to lay a main of sufficient size from your works to one of the buildings on the Home grounds, to be designated by the Board of Managers, and to furnish them a meter of proper size for measuring the flow of gas. We are to pay you as follows each quarter : \$1.50 per thousand until the annual consumption reaches 4,000,000 feet ; \$1.40 per thousand when annual consumption exceeds 4,000,000 and does not reach 5,000,000 feet ; \$1.35 per thousand when annual consumption exceeds 5,000,000 and does not reach 6,000,000 feet ; \$1.30 per thousand when annual consumption exceeds 6,000,000 feet.

Should the prices paid by private consumers in the city of Leavenworth be reduced to less than \$2 per thousand feet, a proportionate reduction shall be made to the Home.

The quality of the gas shall be equal to that furnished to consumers in the city of Leavenworth. The contract I would recommend to endure for five years from its date. I also wish to obtain from your company the necessary piping, &c., it being understood that the price to be paid your company is the net price paid by you, and that we are to have all reasonable means of ascertaining this price. Should we desire to have an employé of your company superintend the work of laying the pipes, &c., such superintendence is to be furnished free of cost to the home. A notice of six months by either party will be sufficient to terminate the contract.

After conference with the mayor of the city and our finance committee for the Soldiers' Home fund, I am directed to respectfully ask that the contract between your Board and the city of Leavenworth be so modified that the city shall pay the sum of \$2,500 semi-annually, on January 1 and July 1 of each year, instead of \$5,000, on October 1 of each year.

This change is asked because our taxes are collected in January and July. In all other respects the contract to remain as it is.

Governor Hospital for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers, Milwaukee, Wis.:

DEAR SIR: We will install in the Soldiers' Home an Edison incandescent electric light plant, consisting of the following :

(1) One Edison dynamo (No. 8), having capacity for the production of one hundred and sixty (160) amperes of current, which is sufficient to supply two hundred (200) Edison lamps of sixteen (16) candle-power each.

(2) One hand regulator for controlling the current and enabling the engineer to keep the lamps at a uniform candle-power.

(3) One ampere meter, showing the load at all times carried by the dynamo.

(4) Pressure indicator, showing the current being delivered.

(5) A complete system of wiring, running from the dynamo to main building, where lamps will be distributed as follows.

(6) A complete equipment of two hundred (200) lamps of 16 candle-power each, and two hundred (200) key-sockets.

(7) Each lamp to be provided with a plain porcelain shade, with shade-holder.

(8) All lamps to be suspended from present gas chandeliers by suitable attachments.

(9) All wires within buildings to be concealed by moldings, and the whole to be provided with the safety devices peculiar to the Edison system.

(10) Switches to be provided where required for the convenient turning on or off of groups of lights.

(11) The outside line to be run on poles, which are to be furnished by us, but to be set up by you.

(12) An Armington & Simms automatic cut-off high-speed engine, of suitable capacity, to be placed in the old hospital building, near your steam supply; the foundation for said engine, and the connections with your boiler, to be done by you, upon plans and specifications to be furnished by us.

(13) An endless belt connecting the engine to dynamo.

All the above-mentioned material and workmanship to be first-class in every particular.

With the plant we guarantee that the dynamo shall furnish the current specified; that the engine shall have ample power to operate the same; that the lamps shall be of the full candle-power specified, and that they will have an average life of at least six hundred hours, when burned at their rated candle-power, and that we will sell lamps for renewals at 85 cents each.

The price for this plant to be \$4,660, to be paid to us in thirty days from the installation and first successful operation of the plant; or, if longer time than that may be agreed upon for all or any portion of said price, then interest at the rate of 7 per cent. on the portion so deferred from said date until paid.

The president presented a communication from Dr. Towle, surgeon of the Southern Branch, requesting the appointment of an assistant surgeon at that Branch.

After full discussion, on motion of Colonel Harris, it was resolved that the office of assistant surgeon be created by the Board, the compensation to be the same as that now paid to the second assistant surgeon at the Central Branch.

The president having announced the death of Maj. Gen. George B. McClellan since the last meeting of the Board, on motion of General Black, a committee, consisting of General Franklin, General Negley, and General McMahan, was appointed to draft appropriate resolutions.

The following resolutions were subsequently presented and ordered to be spread upon the minutes:

The members of the Board of Managers of the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers mourn, with deep sorrow, the death of their distinguished colleague, Maj. Gen. George B. McClellan, late Commander-in-Chief of the Armies of the United States. They deem it proper in their own behalf, and in the name of the many thousands of disabled comrades committed to their care, that this expression of their grief be entered upon their minutes, with a short record of the illustrious public career of this most eminent soldier and patriotic citizen. He entered West Point in June, 1842, graduating in 1846, immediately entering the Army as brevet second lieutenant of Engineers. In the year 1847 he was ordered to Mexico; was brevetted first lieutenant for gallant conduct at Contreras and Churubusco, and brevetted captain for gallant and meritorious conduct at Chapultepec. After the end of the war he was ordered to West Point as instructor in field fortifications and commander of the company of sappers and miners. In 1851 he was ordered to Fort Delaware, to superintend its construction. In 1852 he accompanied Capt. R. B. Marcy, United States Army, on an expedition to explore the Red River. The same year he surveyed the rivers and harbors of the State of Texas as senior engineer. In the spring of 1852 he explored the Yakima Pass. After executing a secret service in the West Indies, and receiving a commission in the United States Cavalry in 1855, he was appointed to proceed to the Crimea to observe the operation of the war, and made an able and exhaustive report on that subject. Resigning, in 1857, his position in the Army, he became successively chief engineer and vice-president of the Illinois Central Railroad, and president of the Ohio and Mississippi Railroad. At the outbreak of the war of the rebellion he was appointed major-general of the Ohio militia, and placed in command of the forces of the State. On the 22d of May, 1861, he was appointed major-general in the United States Army. He conducted a brief and brilliant campaign in Western Virginia, winning the battles of Rich Mountain and Beverly, and driving the enemy from that section of the State. Called to command in Washington after the battle of Bull Run. On the 1st of November, 1861, before completing his thirty-fifth year, he was made Commander-in-Chief of the Armies of the United States. For his display of high military qualities and his brilliant and decisive victories, he received the thanks of the House of Representatives of Congress. Relieved from command of the Army of the United States by the President, upon taking the field in immediate command of the Army of the Potomac. In 1862 he compelled the evacuation of Yorktown; fought the battles of Williamsburg, Hanover Court House, Fair Oaks, Seven Pines; conducted the flank movement to the James River, fighting the seven days' battles: Mechanicsville, Beaver Dam, Gaines' Mill, Golding Farm, Peach Orchard, Savage Station, White Oak Swamp, Glendale, Malvern Hill, in Virginia; South Mountain, Crampton's Pass, and Antietam, in Maryland. Relieved from command of the Army of the Potomac, and ordered to Trenton, N. J., November 5, 1862. He was nominated as the Democratic candidate for President of the United States, on August 31, 1864. He resigned his commission in the United States Army in November, 1864. In 1877 he was elected governor of New Jersey. He passed to his final rest at his home in Orange, N. J., on October 29, 1885, in the midst of his family, showing upon the near approach of a painful death the patient Christian fortitude that had been one of the chief characteristics of his life. General McClellan was one of the foremost men of his age and generation. As Commander-in-Chief of the Armies of the United States he prepared the means, devised the methods, and outlined the paths by which this Union moved through long and des-

perate conflicts of arms to final and everlasting triumph. Under his command the Army of the Potomac, which he created at his country's call, achieved most brilliant victories, and made his life one of the most illustrious pages of his country's history. As a man, as a citizen, as a soldier, he left to his country a bright and high example of manly virtue; to his family and those who loved him, the priceless inheritance of his spotless record. He was three times ordered to Trenton, the capital of New Jersey: Once by the Secretary of War, to the great grief of the army from which he was separated, when no military operations were pending near that city; again, by the people of New Jersey as governor of the State; and a third time, to his last resting-place by the Supreme Commander of all, to await the final muster. By the brave soldiers who fought under him with unfaltering trust on many fields, by the people of the United States who honored him with their high esteem and confidence, even by the gallant foe against whom he led the armed hosts of the Union, he will be held in lifelong, tender, and affectionate remembrance.

The secretary reported that in the matter of the applications for the effects of John Skinner, late Company I, Fifty-fifth Illinois Volunteers, who died at the Northwestern Branch, and which had been referred to the secretary, with power, that application had been made by the daughter of the deceased by a former wife, and also by the widow, both residing outside the State of Wisconsin. Subsequently letters of administration were duly issued to the public administrator in Milwaukee, and the treasurer was thereupon directed to turn over the effects to that officer and notify the parties in interest.

The committee appointed to audit the accounts of the acting treasurer, and to inspect the securities of the ward fund in his hands, submitted the following report, which was received and ordered on the minutes:

WASHINGTON, D. C., *April 7, 1886.*

The Board met in regular quarterly session, at the Riggs House, in the city of Washington, D. C., at 11 a. m.

Present: General W. B. Franklin, president of the Board; Col. L. A. Harris, first vice-president; General M. T. McMahon, secretary; Maj. D. C. Fulton, General James S. Negley, General John C. Black, General Thomas W. Hyde.

Absent: The President of the United States; the Chief Justice; the Secretary of War; General John A. Martin.

On motion the minutes of the last meeting were approved.

The Board proceeded to the election of officers for the ensuing year. A ballot was had, which resulted in the election of the following named officers:

President: General W. B. Franklin.

First vice-president: Col. L. A. Harris.

Second vice-president: General John A. Martin.

Secretary: General M. T. McMahon.

The president presented the estimates for the quarter ending June 30, 1886; which, after careful revision, were agreed upon, as follows:

Resolved, That the Board of Managers of the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers estimate and appropriate out of the moneys which may be provided by law the sum of \$297,042.98, as necessary to meet the current expenses of the five branches of the Home for the quarter ending June 30, 1886, and for construction and repairs, out door relief, and incidental expenses of the National Home; and that the acting treasurer be, and he is hereby, authorized and empowered, to take such means as may be necessary to obtain the sum of \$297,042.98 from the Treasury of the United States, and to receipt therefor in the name and behalf of the National Home.

On motion of General Black, the question of improved water-supply at the Central Branch, was referred to the president and local manager, with power to proceed with the work of furnishing water from driven wells on land to be purchased for the purpose, upon being satisfied that the proposed system will yield an adequate supply of wholesome water, and that the sum of \$25,000 be, and the same is hereby, appropriated for this purpose.

On motion the following resolution was adopted.

Resolved, That the president and acting treasurer of the Board be, and he is hereby authorized to legally purchase bedding, clothing, and materials for the same, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1887.

The president presented the following report on the refunding of the North Carolina State bonds belonging to the Ward fund; which was received and ordered to be entered on the minutes:

On motion, the action of the president was confirmed, and Dr. J. L. Wever was duly elected surgeon of said Branch.

On motion of General Negley, the salary of the surgeon of the Central Branch was fixed at \$2,400 per annum from and after the 30th of June, 1886.

The president presented an application of the governor of the Central Branch for additional quarters for the use of the adjutant; which, upon motion, was referred to the local manager, with power.

Colonel Harris, to whom the matter was heretofore referred (printed Minutes, p. 59, Vol. II), presented a contract executed by him with the Home Avenue Railroad Company for the extension of their tracks; which, upon motion, was ordered to be entered upon the minutes, as follows:

This agreement, made this 25th day of November, 1885, by and between the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers, party of the first part, and the Home Avenue Railroad Company, party of the second part, witnesseth:

Whereas the Board of Managers of said The National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers desires steam railway facilities for the transportation and delivery of coal and other supplies directly to the new boiler-house just erected at the Central Branch of said Soldiers' Home, near Dayton, Montgomery County, Ohio;

And whereas the railroad belonging to and operated by the said party of the second part now extends into and upon the grounds owned by said party of the first part:

Now, therefore, the said party of the second part, in consideration of the sum of \$1 to it paid by the said party of the first part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and in consideration of the covenants hereinafter contained and on the part of said party of the first part to be done and performed, agrees and binds itself to extend the tracks of its said railroad along such route as may be selected by the party of the first part from a point at or near the place where it now enters the grounds of said Central Branch to said new boiler-house, and to lay with new ties and rails the main track and all side-tracks which may be necessary or convenient for the transaction of the business to be done upon such extension.

The said party of the first part agrees that it will procure the right of way for said extension and the necessary side-tracks free of expense to said party of the second part, and that it, the said party of the first part, will grade and make the roadbed for said entire extension and side-tracks, and ballast the same when the tracks shall have been laid, and keep said roadbed in good order and ballasted so long as it may be used.

The said party of the second part agrees that it will furnish and lay the ties and rails for said main-track extension and side-tracks within a reasonable time after the preparation of said roadbed, and that it will, at its own expense, keep said tracks properly aligned and in good repair so long as the same may be used; and in ballasting said tracks all tamping of ties is to be done by the said party of the second part.

After said ties and rails have been laid, any changes in the route or location of said tracks are to be made at the expense of said party of the first part.

The said The Home Avenue Railroad Company is to have the exclusive right to operate said extension and side-tracks to said boiler-house.

The said party of the second part agrees that it will, at any time when required by the said party of the first part, take up and remove said ties and rails from said extension and side-tracks, or either of them; but when so required said party of the second part shall receive from said party of the first part the difference between the value of old and new rails and ties and a just compensation for the removal of the same.

It is further agreed, that this contract shall in no way affect or impair the terms and conditions of the original grant of the right of way into said Home grounds made by said party of the first part to said party of the second part.

In testimony whereof the said The National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers, by Leonard A. Harris, local manager thereof, duly authorized, and the said The Home Avenue Railroad Company, by its president, also duly authorized, have hereto and to a duplicate hereof, set their corporate names this 25th day of November, 1885.

The president presented a communication from the governor of the Northwestern Branch in relation to the water-supply at that Branch.

On motion, and after full discussion, the consideration of the question was postponed.

On motion of General Hyde, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the office of assistant surgeon be established at the Eastern Branch, and that the president of the Board be authorized to appoint a suitable person to fill said office and fix his compensation, subject to the approval of the Board.

The question of securing the right of way at the Western Branch from the Kansas City Road over lands not belonging to the Home, after a full consideration and discussion, was referred to the president, with power to secure the same.

Upon motion of General Black, it was resolved that \$300 be appropriated from the general fund to repair the approaches to the Southern Branch, the same to be expended under the direction of the governor.

The general fund, as per report of treasurer, shows the average cost of ration \$17.74, as against \$21.16 in 1885; of clothing \$18.31, as against \$26.84 in 1885; per capita \$124.05, as against \$146.75 in 1885; general expenditures \$640,959.58, as against \$686,380.56 in 1885.

SHOPS.

The various shops have been operated during the year in the most economical manner, the tailor-shop especially turning out a very large quantity of clothing, not only for our own but for the other branches of the National Home.

PENSION FUND.

Although the number of pensioners stands at 2,076 as against 2,083 in 1885, the amount to be paid to families is \$94,739.11 as against \$93,053.79 in 1885, and the amount paid to pensioners \$221,277.66 as against \$185,143.35 in 1885. This increase in the amount paid to a smaller number of pensioners is due to large arrearages secured during the year, as also to increased rates allowed by recent act of Congress.

As will be seen on sheet No. 27, the sum of \$62,315.52 is held by the Home at interest in United States bonds for the benefit of the pensioners.

POSTHUMOUS FUND.

There has been added to the posthumous fund within the last year over \$10,000, including \$945 interest on United States registered bonds.

POST FUND.

Owing to various causes, the profits derived from investments made by the post fund have not been so remunerative as in former years.

Of the visitors that come here annually, the greater mass come as excursionists, bringing their eatables (and drinkables oftentimes) with them, using hotel and restaurant merely as conveniences, and leaving little or no money in return.

ADJUTANT'S REPORT.

The adjutant's report of averages shows an extraordinary increase in the number of sick over 1885 and the preceding years. This is due, almost entirely, to a change in the system of treating the sick, it being

found productive of better results to send to hospital a much larger proportion of those who report at sick call (at the dispensary) than to retain them as heretofore, in quarters, where they could not receive proper medical treatment.

Our average present has been 4,249 as against 4,191 in 1885; present and absent 5,167 as against 5,081 in 1885; whole number cared for, 6,020, as against 6,884 in 1885, the number of transient persons, many of whom are mere tramps, having found it more difficult to obtain admission and readmission than heretofore.

An examination of the annual returns and the following tables shows, notwithstanding our large average present, 3,894 arrests or charges as against 4,368 in 1885.

A comparison of the list of charges with those of former years exhibits a gratifying improvement in the good order and conduct of the members of this branch.

SUBSISTENCE.

At no time since I came on duty at this branch has this department been so well equipped as at present.

EMPLOYMENT.

Number of men on extra duty with pay, 1,936 as against 1,372 in 1885 (when, for want of money, we were obliged to dispense with all labor not absolutely necessary for current purposes).

Extra duty without pay, 1,450 as against 336 in 1885.

This increased number of members working without pay arises from two causes:

First, from keeping the accounts of all men on dump for misdemeanors as on duty without pay, as also the placing of a much larger number of applicants for admission on light work, such as camp, police, and the like, until their disabilities can be better understood, and the question of their full admission be more satisfactorily determined.

In this way we avoid the harboring of vagabonds and tramps, who (though perfectly able) are too lazy or vicious to do anything but beg or play the "dead beat." A few days of light work and the restraints to which they are subjected causes this class of men to resume their tramp life, so soon as their stomachs are filled and their backs warmed.

AMUSEMENTS.

There has been a less number of dramatic performances here during the last year than usual. The demands upon our post fund being greater than our receipts, we have been unable, until recently, to have as many entertainments at the hall as in former years. A dramatic company has been giving performances twice a week since June 5.

VISITORS.

The Home continues to be flooded with visitors and excursion parties during all the warm season, 186,321 having been reported within the year.

HEALTH.

As noted on averages, the reasons were given for the disproportion in the rating of sick between 1886 and 1885. It will be seen under this

head that a very much larger number were treated at sick call than in 1885, and the number treated in convalescent companies nearly doubled, while the number treated in hospital increased from 1,248 in 1885 to 2,031 in 1886.

The cases of insanity are becoming more frequent every year, as also the number of those who are becoming blind. The number of cases treated by Dr. Green, the oculist and aurist, are embodied in the general return of the chief surgeon.

SANITARY REGULATIONS.

The sanitary regulations have not been, in some respects, as thoroughly carried out during the last year as in former years in consequence of the scarcity of water. Fearful lest we should be deprived of sufficient water to meet our absolute necessities, it was found necessary to dispense with its use in many places, and for various purposes which had hitherto been abundantly supplied.

The rules as to bathing are that every member in the Home, outside the hospital, is required to bathe once a week. Bathing takes place between the hours of 5 a. m. and 6 p. m. every day, except Sundays.

The rules are generally well observed, and the results derived from the baths taken are claimed by the majority of the members to be very beneficial to their health. Owing to the scarcity of water in the Home from December 1, 1884, to May 1, 1886, only one bath was allowed to each member per month, but on May 1, 1886, we reopened with regular weekly bathing, and up to June 30, 1886, we have furnished nearly 13,000 baths per month.

RELIGION AND SOCIETIES.

The long-continued illness of Chaplain Earnshaw terminated in death July 17, 1885. From that time until January 26, following, the English-Protestant pulpit was supplied by clergymen of various denominations from Dayton and its vicinity, the greater portion of the time the services being very ably and satisfactorily conducted by Rev. Dr. Holt, of Dayton.

Since the entrance upon his duties of the Rev. J. V. Lerch, the present chaplain, regular services have been held in the church Sabbath morning and evening, as well as the lecture and prayer service on Wednesday evening.

Sunday school has also been held every Sunday morning before the regular service.

The Woman's Christian Association of Dayton has held its meetings in the same room fortnightly, on Tuesday afternoon, through the year. The attendance upon these services has been good, and 62 persons have associated themselves with the "Church Association" since February 1, 1886. Of these two were baptized, several received by letter from other churches, but most on confession of faith.

The reception hours for men in the study, from 8 to 11 a. m., four days in the week, have been well improved and productive of good results.

Hospital visitations and comforting of the sick and dying are of daily occurrence.

The Rev. Dr. Kemper, Catholic chaplain, has held throughout the year, on Sunday at 9 a. m., high mass and sermon; at 2.30 p. m., vespers and benediction; Wednesday evening, prayer, and usually an address; Thursday morning, mass and prayers. He has also attended sixty-eight funerals.

In connection with the Catholic church at this branch there are two strictly religious associations, "The Purgatorian Society" and the "Association for the Propagation of the Faith," the members of both paying small monthly fees, which are wholly devoted to religious purposes.

The Hibernian Society, though primarily of a national character, is yet composed exclusively of Catholics, and in some ways closely connected with the Catholic congregation.

Father Kemper, though not residing on the Home grounds (being connected with Saint Elizabeth's Hospital), is here most of the time on Sundays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays; sometimes occupied in the chapel, sometimes in the hospital, many of the wards of which are visited not only on those days, but frequently at other times.

There have been other religious services held at the chapel, especially one in every month by Rev. O. L. Barber, of the New Jerusalem Church.

For the German-speaking Protestants the Rev. H. Gillert has been in the habit of preaching every Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock in the chapel.

The duties of librarian, with which the late Chaplain Earnshaw was charged, have been performed since his decease by the governor, who will for the present retain control of both the Putnam and Thomas libraries. A large number of the men spend the greater portion of their time in the library and reading-room.

There is not sufficient room at our disposal to place the books belonging to these libraries upon the shelves. We have in the "Thomas Library" 8,327 volumes and in the "Putnam Library" 6,456 volumes, to which additions are made every year of carefully selected works, by the generous lady whose name it bears.

POST-OFFICE.

The post-office return shows the very large amount of business done through the mails of this branch. To accomplish the work required in that office has taxed its facilities to the utmost. It is hoped that before the close of the current year a more convenient location with greater facilities may be placed at our disposal.

PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS.

The additional story placed upon the bath-house has given us a large amount of barrack room, which was greatly needed in connection with Company 30.

The remodeling of the old boiler-house, in rear of the hospital, has given two of the largest and most desirable wards connected with the hospital.

The new central boiler-house will soon be in readiness for occupation, which, in connection with the system of tunneling partially completed and now in progress, will afford the means of conveying light, heat, and water throughout the camp, at a large saving of time, money, and labor.

The extension of the Home Avenue Railroad through the Home grounds to this new boiler-house will also relieve us from the very heavy burden of hauling our coal by team and twice handling it, at a heavy loss.

The receiving vault, to the north of the hospital, is not fully completed, requiring a small appropriation for that purpose.

MANUFACTURES.

Under the head of "Manufactures" is exhibited the large amount of outer clothing, socks, towels, shrouds, and under-clothing made here, at a valuation of \$102,872.64.

FARM AND GARDEN.

The products of the farm and garden foot up \$28,169.69.

In the main, the yield of hay, grain, and vegetables, last year was very satisfactory, although the potato crop was greatly damaged by the bugs, whose ravages it seemed impossible to prevent.

Up to the present time, the farm and garden crops appear well, but in many places, both on the farm and in the vegetable garden, the violent rain storms washed out the seeds and flooded large areas, drowning out the young plants. Some later storms had also the effect of beating down the grain and clover crops, causing a considerable loss in the returns of both crops.

Our horned cattle and working teams are in good condition, and the latter doing good work. From some unknown cause, a number of our best cows have aborted, and we have not as many calves to raise as we had expected.

We have also been unfortunate in the loss of a number of fawns, from the deer park, which can only be accounted for by the faithlessness of the man who had for years been in charge, but who was secretly indulging in bad habits during the winter. As we have some new blood from the Indian country, we hope this year to be more fortunate in raising fawns, from the infusion of stronger blood.

REMARKS.

In looking back upon the past year the improvement in our system of heating, &c., is worthy of special attention.

In the early years of this institution, and before the demand for its extension to its present capacity could have been foreseen, the system of conveying water, steam, and gas through the camp by pipes laid in the ground, at a depth of 2 or 3 feet, was adopted. The pipes were small: a very large percentage of heat was absorbed by the earth in which the pipes were imbedded, and they became rusty, corroded, and brittle. Leakages of water by the bursting of these pipes were of frequent occurrence, and the escape of gas filled the soil with vile odors in all directions, greatly to the detriment of the health and comfort of our men.

In the summer and autumn of 1885, a tunnel was built from the hospital, on the north, to the laundry, on the south, and the new boiler-house in the center, 2,550 feet in length.

The experience of the last winter has shown us that this tunnel is a success, in every respect, conveying all the pipes, save those of sewage, retaining all the heat generated, and exposing, at a glance, any defect or accident to the pipes, without any trouble to search for them by digging at random or guess-work.

At no time in the past has the camp been so thoroughly provided, in all these respects, as during the last winter. This system will be completed with the appropriation of the present quarter.

The past year has also been one of health in the Home. The first case of typhoid fever ever known to our medical officers at this branch has

occurred this present season, the patient being a member of the band (a citizen), but recently employed, and who had probably contracted the disease before he came here.

It is remarkable that the average age at which members die is increasing about one year, annually.

For the past two and a half years (as has already been remarked) we have not been able to obtain a water supply equal to the demand for sanitary purposes. We have not had sufficient to flush our drains and sewers, to flood our vaults, to sprinkle our streets and lawns, or to flush our lakes and ponds, in which the water has become stagnant and impure. We have every reason to believe that no such report in regard to the water supply will have to be made at the close of the current year. There is scarcely room to doubt that we have struck a vein that is practically inexhaustible.

At the close of my last year's report, a passing allusion was made to the Congressional investigation of 1884. The beneficial effects of that investigation can scarcely be estimated in their influence upon this Home. Without questioning the motives which originated it, or the methods by which it was conducted, the results have been a more thorough acquaintance, by the public generally, with the principles upon which the affairs of the institution are administered, and a recognition of the fact that an autonomy must exist in and for the government of the Home, uncontrolled and uninfluenced by theorists, speculators, and politicians.

Just in proportion as this simple policy of the Board is understood by reasonable citizens, it is approved and acted upon, resulting year by year in the improved condition of our members, bringing to us as a body a greater degree of sobriety, quiet, contentment, and freedom from unhealthy excitements originating without and productive of mischief within.

SANITARY REGULATIONS.

The rules as to bathing are that every member in the Home outside of the hospital is required to bathe once a week. Bathing takes place between the hours of 5 a. m. and 6 p. m. each day except Sundays.

The rules are generally well observed, and the results derived from the baths taken are claimed by the majority of the members to be very beneficial to their health.

Owing to the scarcity of water in the Home from December 1, 1884, to May 1, 1886, only one bath was allowed to each member per month, but on May 1, 1886, we reopened with regular weekly bathing, and up to June 30, 1886, we have furnished nearly 13,000 baths per month.

RELIGION AND SOCIETIES.

After the death of Chaplain Ernschaw, on July 17, 1885, the English Protestant pulpit was supplied by clergymen from Dayton and vicinity until the appointment of Rev. J. V. Lerch, who assumed his duties January 26, 1886, since which time regular services have been held in the church each Sabbath morning and evening at the usual hours.

The usual lecture and prayer service has been held on Wednesday evening each week.

The Woman's Christian Association of Dayton has held meetings in the church on every alternate Tuesday afternoon during the year.

The Sunday school is held on Sunday morning before the regular service, and recently it has been reorganized, making a separate school for the children of the Home, which affords a better opportunity for their instruction.

All the services of the church have been well attended and the best of order has prevailed and devout attention given to the preached word, which is very encouraging, and speaks well for those who have never seriously considered religious matters.

Sixty-two persons have regularly associated themselves with the church since February 1, two through the ordinance of baptism and confirmation, several by confirmation and the right hand of fellowship.

Most have been received on a reconfession of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. A few have been received by letter from other churches.

The reception hours for men in the study of the church have been well improved and the results are very encouraging. Visits to the hospital and the comforting of the sick and dying are almost daily occurrences. Since January 26 the chaplain has officiated at 61 funerals.

Services have been held in the Catholic church as follows: Sunday, 9 a. m., mass and sermon; Sunday, 2.30 p. m., vespers and benediction; Wednesday evening, prayers, and frequently an address; Thursday, 7.30 a. m., mass and prayers; funerals, 68.

There are two strictly religious associations connected with the Catholic church, the "Purgatorian Society" and the "Association for the Propagation of the Faith," the members of both paying small monthly fees, which are wholly devoted to purely religious purposes.

Dr. Charles S. Kemper, the Catholic chaplain, is at the Home at some time on Sunday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Saturday, either occupied in the chapel or in the hospital, all or some of the wards of which he visits on those days not only once, but frequently, especially on Sunday and Saturdays, oftener.

The "Hibernian Society," though primarily of a national character, is yet composed exclusively of Catholics and in some ways closely connected with the Catholic congregation.

Friday.—*Breakfast*: Boiled meat, stewed codfish, bread, butter, coffee. *Dinner*: Soup, boiled beef, baked codfish or fresh fish, potatoes, pickles, bread, coffee. *Supper*: Apple or peach sauce, ginger-bread, bread, butter, tea.

Saturday.—*Breakfast*: Meat-hash, bread, butter, coffee. *Dinner*: Corned beef, stewed onions, potatoes, pickled beets, bread pudding, bread, coffee. *Supper*: Cold meat, pickles, bread, butter, tea.

Changes are made in the general dining hall bill of fare quarterly, vegetables being freely used when procurable.

The hospital bill of fare is prescribed by the surgeon.

SANITARY REGULATIONS.

General Orders No. 19, dated May 9, 1875, requires each member to take a bath at least once a week, which has been carried out during the year with results beneficial to their health and cleanliness.

RELIGION AND SOCIETIES.

The Protestant Episcopal chaplain, Rev. C. L. Mallory, reports as follows:

There has been no material change in the work under my direction since my last report. The attendance upon the service has been good throughout the year, with the exception of two Sundays, when away on leave. I have conducted services and preached each Lord's day at 3 o'clock in the afternoon.

On the second Sunday in each month I have celebrated the Holy Communion at 8.30 a. m.

A Sunday school under my general direction, and in which I teach a class, numbers 52 pupils, with 6 teachers.

The offerings of the congregation for charitable and religious objects amounted to \$105.72.

I have officiated at the burial of 42 deceased members.

Report of the Roman Catholic chaplain, Rev. M. F. Speich, S. J.:

The regular services which were held on Saturday evenings, Sunday mornings, and on holy days of obligation, aggregate for the year 118. The average attendance at each service was 300, and the sacraments of penance and holy eucharists were received no fewer than 3,710 times.

I visited the hospital two or three times a week, spending from one to two hours in the different wards, consoling the sick, and administering to the dying the consolations of religion.

I have been called upon to perform the funeral services over the remains of 38 members.

I am gratified to see, and consider it my pleasing duty to state, that many of the members avail themselves of the ample time and opportunity given them to serve God, and follow the dictates of their conscience.

My sincere thanks are due to the governor and to the officers in charge of the Home and the hospital, for their kindness to me personally, and the interest shown me in the performance of the duties entrusted to my care.

SOCIETIES.

A post of the Grand Army of the Republic, known as Veteran Post No. 8, has been maintained at this Branch during the year by members of the Home. They hold weekly meetings in a room set apart for that purpose.

GENERAL: I have the honor to submit the following report of this branch for the year ending June 30, 1886:

BARRACKS.

During the winter our barracks were crowded to their utmost capacity, in fact beyond the limit which insures comfort and health. It seems almost cruel to the feeble and sometimes helpless men, who are crowded upon us in the cold season, that they should be compelled to sleep on the floors, exposed to cold drafts and the bad air, which cannot be avoided under the circumstances. The new barrack, which accommodated one hundred men when completed, relieved in some measure this trouble, but even if our membership were not increased, our barracks will be too crowded for the comfort and health of the occupants. I attribute, in a large measure, the greatly increased mortality the past year to insufficient sleeping accommodation.

The veterans of New England and Eastern New York who are compelled to ask refuge, from want, in the National Home naturally seek the Eastern Branch. The class who are now seeking admission are men who have been able to care for themselves since the war terminated, but are now forced by age and disease to get their support at the Homes. They leave their homes and families and come to this place because it is the nearest to the towns or cities where they have lived, and to which they are still bound by ties of affection and interest. At a moderate estimate the number of veteran soldiers now living in New England can be fixed at 125,000, many of whom must eventually seek support at the Eastern Branch of the National Home.

To meet this demand, which will greatly exceed the natural decrease by discharge and death, some provision should be made at this Branch, unless a new home is established nearer than the Southern or Central Branches.

HOSPITAL.

This Home is sadly in need of a new hospital, our present building being much inferior in every respect to those that have been or are in the process of construction at the other branches. It needs the improvements and conveniences of the modern hospitals, and is so small that not one-half of the members can be accommodated who need care and treatment under the immediate supervision of the surgeon.

LIBRARY.

Number of books in the library, 6,246; an increase of 133 since last report. Our reading-room is supplied with 162 daily and weekly papers and 22 magazines, which are in constant use.

AMUSEMENTS.

Every effort is made to supply the men with good wholesome amusements. During the past year a shooting-gallery has been established, and has proved a success as a means of employment to the members of the Home. A new deer-park has also been constructed, in which it is proposed to collect specimens of the various animals that inhabit the forests of Maine.

SANITARY REGULATIONS.

With regard to sanitary regulations, I can simply repeat my statement of last year, giving our rules for regulating bathing, viz: Members of the Home are required to bathe once in each week, unless for special reasons they are excused by the surgeon. Bath-tubs in separate rooms are furnished with a sufficient supply of hot and cold water and the same are kept scrupulously clean and neat. Bath-tickets are furnished by the company sergeants to each man, who is required to deposit the same with the attendant at the bath-house before taking his bath. These tickets are returned to the company sergeants for examination, and the neglect on the part of any member to comply with the rules requiring bathing is noted and the party compelled to bathe in accordance with orders. Since the new bathing rooms were finished but little trouble is experienced in this respect, the men apparently considering the bath a necessity and a luxury. As far as can be ascertained the sanitary effect is excellent; but I am sorry to say that, on account of the scarcity of water during a portion of the warm season, we have been compelled to omit bathing entirely, the water supply being only sufficient for steam, laundry, and cooking purposes. Some of the men supply this want by bathing in the ponds and streams which are not far distant from the Home, but the class of members who when our bathing facilities are ample have to be watched and even forced to bathe go for weeks without performing a duty so essential to cleanliness and health.

I cannot too strongly urge upon your attention the necessity of some action for the increase of our water supply.

RELIGION AND SOCIETIES.

Rev. Charles L. Wells, Protestant Episcopal chaplain, reports as follows:

Well-attended services have been held on Sunday afternoons at 3 o'clock, preceded, when the season would allow, by a Sunday-school session of an hour. Two Bible classes and four other classes for children gave an attendance of from twenty to forty each Sunday. A Sunday-school festival, with a Christmas tree at Christmas, was greatly enjoyed. I have visited the hospital and, at my own expense, distributed several Bibles, prayer-books, and Testaments.

I have administered the holy communion twice and baptism once, and have officiated at forty-two funerals.

Rev. J. M. McCarthy reports as follows:

Catholic services at the Home are held with the usual regularity and are well attended. I wish to say, also, that every facility which the institution affords is at my disposal, for which I trust the members and the priest are correspondingly grateful.

There are two societies in the Home, as follows:

ANNUAL REPORT OF SOUTHERN BRANCH, NATIONAL HOME FOR DISABLED VOLUNTEER SOLDIERS.

SOUTHERN BRANCH, NATIONAL HOME FOR DISABLED VOLUNTEER SOLDIERS, *Hampton, Va., August 19, 1886.*

GENERAL: I have the honor to submit the following report of this branch for the year ending June 30, 1886:

Notwithstanding every effort being made by the authorities of the Home to keep the membership of this branch within the limits of its accommodations, the following figures show an increase of about 10

per cent. in the number of members present during the year, thus necessitating over-crowding :

Number present June 30, 1885.....	1,395
Present and absent June 30, 1885.....	1,920
Number present June 30, 1886.....	1,578
Present and absent June 30, 1886.....	2,138

Charity compelled this increase, none being admitted except such as, from their disability and circumstances, a rejection would have stamped the management as inhuman. Had all applications for admission been approved the increase would have approximated 30 per cent. Such increase being far above our capacity, measures of relief had to be adopted, and Congress asked for an appropriation sufficient to provide not only for our increase during the year past, but for the large number who will certainly apply during the current year.

I am pleased to announce the generous response of Congress to our appeal for aid, an appropriation having been granted, which will enable this branch to be extended so as to provide for a membership of two thousand present, with suitable extension of plant for water, steam, gas, and sewerage. When additions and improvements are completed this branch of the Home will equal any public institution in the country.

The *morale* of the men during the year has been very gratifying ; in fact their conduct has been all that the Home authorities could wish, showing that the efforts made to provide for their comfort have been appreciated ; consequently they have been contented and happy.

The officers and non-commissioned officers who have by their untiring energies contributed to this end are entitled to the thanks of this office, which I extend to them.

From the men I ask a continuance of their good behavior during the current year, so that at its close a report equally as good as this may be made.

The secretary, treasurer, and commissary of subsistence says : " Referring to the condition and operations of the departments under my charge during the fiscal year ending 30th June, 1886, I have the honor to state that I have nothing to offer beyond the facts shown in the figures submitted in the annual report."

The surgeon reports : " No epidemic, and but few cases of severe acute, disease occurred at this Home during the year ending 30th June, 1886.

" The wards completed in the new hospital have proved satisfactory in all particulars, the ventilation deserving special commendation.

" It has been necessary to place patients in the assembly-room and other parts of the hospital not intended for wards, but this will soon be obviated by the completion of new wards. The members admitted during the year average lower in strength and health than those here previously."

SANITARY REGULATIONS.

The utmost cleanliness is enjoined and enforced both in regard to quarters and person. The grounds are thoroughly policed every morning, weather permitting.

All are required to bathe weekly, and there is little trouble about it, as every one desires a bath. It is of very rare occurrence for compulsion to be necessary.

During summer months the members, whose disability will permit, take advantage of sea-bathing, a bath-house on the shore with all conveniences being provided for the purpose. The sick under the surgeon's care are, of course, subject to his orders in the matter.

RELIGION AND SOCIETIES.

Religious services are held every Sunday by clergymen of five different denominations, viz: Catholic, Episcopalian, Presbyterian, Methodist, and Baptist. Catholic services every Sunday and on holidays; Protestant services every Sunday by the Protestant clergymen, alternately; all minister to the sick in hospital and officiate at funerals.

REPORTS.

Roman Catholic: The condition of the Catholic congregation at the Home is very encouraging. Some thirty new names appear, and the spirit of the members is all that could be looked for. They have been very regular and assiduous in attending divine service; orderly and devout. They show in many ways that they appreciate the blessing of having a regular chaplain, and do all they can to co-operate in his work. Though everything that could aid in the work of religion is done by the authorities of the Home, and done with all good will and cordiality, the absence of a chapel is a great drawback. I cannot recommend too strongly to the authorities the remedying of this defect at the earliest date possible.

Episcopalian: I would respectfully report the following work done at the Soldier's Home during the past year. I have held one service each month, have visited the hospital once every week (with perhaps a few exceptions), and have officiated at about thirty funerals. I find the men glad to see me when I visit the hospital, and I think the congregations have improved.

Presbyterian: With regard to my work as chaplain for the Home, I would say that nothing has happened since my last report of unusual interest. I have filled my appointments very regularly. During the cold of last winter the attendance was not very good, on account of the impossibility of making the room comfortable. There has been a fair attendance, however, since the cold weather of winter passed. The audiences have been always attentive, and, as far I could judge, very appreciative. I feel encouraged in my work, and, only wish I could do more pastoral work in the hospital among the sick.

We only need a chapel. A place of worship, and that on ground floor. I hope the day may not be far distant when we shall secure one, either from the Government or private contributions.

Methodist: In reporting my services at the Home of which you are the governor I am glad to be able to report to you that I have filled, to the best of my ability, all my appointments for preaching in the hall, have visited the hospital regularly, and have attended the funerals whenever called upon to do so. I take great pleasure in the performance of my duties as one of the chaplains of the Home. Here I find a wide field for ministerial labor. Many of the inmates are from Christian homes, and are very anxious to enjoy the blessing and privileges of the Gospel of Christ. They must feel and know that their span of life will soon be done. I have been with quite a number in their last hours, who have assured me they were ready to depart and be with Christ, that they had no fear of death, so I hope our labors among them have not been in vain. Many of them have told me that they had everything done for them here that they could desire, being well provided for and kindly treated. My associations with the officers and men have been of a very pleasant character, and I hope we have been a mutual benefit to each other. I have endeavored to discharge my duty faithfully as a chaplain, responding promptly to all the demands made upon me from time to time.

Baptist: During the year ending June 30 Protestant services have been regularly held in the opera house every Sunday afternoon. Those attending them have been orderly and attentive, and we have reason to believe that good has been done. The congregations have not been so large as we could wish. This is due, I think, to two principal causes. The first is that a large proportion of the inmates are communicants of the Roman Catholic Church, and, of course, feel no interest in religious services conducted by Protestant ministers; and the second, that many who would be glad to attend are unable to do so by reason of physical infirmity. The labor of getting into the opera house is too great for the "lame and halt."

We are more and more convinced at every service of the imperative need of a chapel so constructed as to be easy of access to the infirm and disabled veterans. The moral and religious interests of the Home would be greatly promoted by such chapel, and we trust the time is not far distant when it will be erected.

ANNUAL REPORT OF WESTERN BRANCH, NATIONAL HOME FOR DISABLED VOLUNTEER SOLDIERS, FOR THE YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1886.

WESTERN BRANCH, NATIONAL HOME
DISABLED VOLUNTEER SOLDIERS.

Kansas, August 21, 1886.

GENERAL: I have the honor to submit the following report of this branch for the year ending June 30, 1886:

The first tri-monthly report of this branch is dated September 10, 1885, and shows an aggregate of 14 members. This was our beginning, and though notice was promulgated that there were no suitable accommodations, strong appeals were being constantly made for us to receive "just one more," and our post return of December 31, 1885, reports a total of 134 members. Up to this time the men were taking their meals in the stone basement of a milk-house, and sleeping in the barn over the stable.

On the first of January, 1886, they were transferred from the barn to the large room over the boiler-house, meals being now served in the basement of an unfinished barrack building. On the first of February, temporary floors, doors, and stairways having been put in the barrack building, a portion of the members (who were still increasing in numbers) were quartered and keeping as comfortable as possible with the aid of huge army stoves, kindly loaned by the officers of Fort Leavenworth; luckily wood was abundant, and willing hands to gather it were not wanting. Thus we passed the winter, doing the best we could to save from perishing from exposure many who but for the shelter here found could not have survived the winter. Notwithstanding the discomforts and our constant efforts to hold off the many applicants for admission, and the fact that we received only such as were completely broken down, homeless, and friendless, the report of June 30 shows an

aggregate of 528, and all are now comfortably housed in our beautiful and healthful new barracks.

One of the new barrack buildings is doing service as a hospital, and, though it answers the requirements very well, it cannot supply the needed facilities for the proper care and attention of the many aged, infirm, sick, and badly crippled among those here and daily arriving, and it is earnestly hoped that a hospital, ample enough for our needs, may soon be provided.

Weekly visits are also made to the sick in hospital by the reverend gentlemen, and funeral services are performed by them.

A Grand Army post was organized in February last, and is at the present time in a very flourishing condition, and when a suitable room can be given to their use the organization will no doubt soon compare favorably with other Grand Army posts in the State.
