The Colored Citizens of Toronto, met in general meeting at the second Wesleyan Church, Richmond St., on Wednesday evening, Sept. 20th, 1854.

Wilson R. Abbott, Esq., was called to the Chair, and Rev. Wm. P. Newman appointed Secretary.

After prayer by Bro. Robinson, the object of the meeting was stated by the chairman, who called upon the Secretary to read from the "Seventeenth Annual Report of the Colonial Church and School Society" which reading showed that the object of Rev. Mr. Dillon's Mission to this country is to establish a separate school, or schools for the colored people.

It was voted, that a Committee of five be appointed, to draft resolutions for another meeting respecting the said Mission.

Rev. Wm. P. Newman, Mr. Adolphus Juda Wilson, R. Abbott, Esq., Rev. Mr. Johnson, were then appointed.

Voted, that W. R. Abbott be a Committee to wait on Mr. Dillon, invite him to attend the next meeting of the colored citizens.

Voted, that we adjourn to meet at the Sayer St. Chapel, on Monday evening of next month, at 7½ o'clock.
